Venice, December 8. N. S.

HE Senate hath refolved to difarm, and break in pieces all the Galeaftes, and to maintain more Men of War, which are thought to be of greater Ufe, and not fo Expensive. The Minister of Tufcany hath notify'd the Death of the Great Prince to the Electrefs of Bavaria, who is returned to this Place. The mortality of Cattle is almost ceas'd in the Pope's Territories, but in the Milaneze and other Countreys thereabouts it in-creases, notwithstanding great diligence has been us'd to prevent the Diltemper from spreading. They write from Rome, that a Confiftory had been held there, in which feveral Bishopricks were difpos'd of, Cardinal Gozzadıni was declar'd Legat at Ravenna, and Monfignor Molca his Vice-Legate. Cardinal de la Tremouille had been very prefing with the Pope to give the King of Sicily Investiture of that Kingdom, without having receiv'd any direct Answer. His Sicilian Majesty had recalled the Bishops that fled from thence some time ago, but they refused to return, till their Cause had been decided at Rome. We have received advice from Naples, that the two Men of War, and the Tranf-port Ships with the Spanish Troops on board, were fet Sail with a fair Wind from Baia to Fiume.

Warsaw, December 16. N. S. It is faid King Augustus intends to set out within two Days for Dref-den, and that he will continue in his Electorate the reft of the Winter. His Majefty is to be follow'd very foon by the great Chancellor of Poland, and the Saxon Ministers, who are here at present. The Plenipotentiaries of the Republick are preparing to go to Brunswick as soon as they have certain infor-mation, that a Congress will be form'd there. Letters from Adrianople of the 14th past bring an account, that the Grand Signior was refolved to re-turn from thence in few Days to Constantinople. It was not known whether our Ambaffador, who had not then been admitted to an Audience, would have Leave to follow him. The uncertainty we are under of the Defigns of the Port, makes the continuance of the Saxon Troops necessary in this Kingdom.

Duffeldorp, December 21. N. S. Yesterday Signor Guiducci arrived Express from Florence, and brought an account, that an Act of Succession had been published there in favour of the Electres Palatine, who is declared Heirefs to the Domi-nions of Tuscany, in case Prince Gaston should happen to die without Issue. The Authority of the Great Duke, and Great Prince, the unanimous Confent of the Senate, the Approbation of the Nobility, and the general Acclamations of the People con-

cur'd in the Solemnity of passing this Act. Berlin, December 23. N.S. On the 20th the Ling return'd from Dessau, and the next Day he went to one of his Palaces near this Place, accom-panied by the Prince of Anhalt, and the Heredi tary Prince of Heffe Caffel. The Lieutenant-Ge-nerals Hake and Tettau, the former of whom was Commandant of this City, died Yesterday. Baron

Goertz arrived here this Morning from Hanover, and in the Evening he fet out for Dreiden, in order to meet King Augustus, who is expected the e very soon. It being One hundred Years fince the Protestant Religion was establish'd in this Country by the Eleft r John Sigifmund, his Majesty hath given Orders to have a Jubilee, upon that occasion, celebrated on Christmas Day, throughout all his Dominions.

Hamburgh, December 26, N. S. The number of those that died last Week amounts to no more than One hundled and three. The Court of Pruffia hath not yet been inform'd of the King of Denmark's Sentiments, in relation to the Treaty they have concluded with the Ministers of Holstein, tho it is faid the Danish Envoy at Berlin hath already received Influctions upon this Point, which he de-fers imparting, till it is feen what Meafures the King of Prufha will take upon the Declarations lately made by Count Golofkin, that the Czar is refolved to adhere firmly to the Interests of his Da-nish Majesty. For the fame reason, it is thought, the Duke of Wirtemberg delays the Execution of his Orders, to suffer Provisions for a Fortnight to be carried into Tonningen. Baron Goertz is gone from Hanover, very much diffatisfied at the Success of his Negotiations, which, it is faid, tended to de-fire the Elector's Mediation in accommodating the Differences between the King of Denmark and the Administrator of Holstein his Master. They write from Sweden, that the Senate had expressed great displeasure at Count Meyerfeld's Behaviour, in delivering up Stetin, as contrary to the Directions he had received, to wait the last Extremity before he furrender'd the Place, and the Affurances he had given that he would defend it fix Months.

Hague, December 29. N. S. The Minifters of the States General, who came lately from Utrecht, have been often in Conference with the Duke d'Offuna and the Marquis de Monteleone, Plenipotentiaries of Spain, as also with Monsieur de Chateauneuf, Ambassador of France, upon the Subject of the Treaty of Peace between his Catholick Majefty and this Republick. The Sieurs Fraula and Castillon, Deputies from the Regency at Bruffels, have had feveral Conferences with the Deputies of the States General upon the Affairs of the Netherlands. Monfieur Vaultier, one of the French Commissaries for Trade, is arrived here from Utrecht. Letters from Radftadt bring an account, that Mareschal Villars expected another Courier from the French Court, upon which account Prince , Eugene had deferr'd his Journy to Vienna till the 26th Inftant.

Windsor, December 22. Her Majesty hath been pleas'd to Sign an Infrument for promoting
