Paris, December 29. N.S. Since the arrival of a Courier on the 26th from Radflat, it has been given out, that the Preliminary Articles of a Treaty of Peace between the Emperor and France have been fign'd by Prince Eugene and Mareschal Villars, and that they are approv'd and ratified by the King and the Elector of Bavaria. These Reports meet with more Credit, fince the Court has begun to reform the Army, having already disbanded Fifty new Regi-ments of Horle, and Nine of Dragoons. However, fome of the Men are incorporated into old Bodies, and the Officers are allow'd half Pay. The Regiment of French Guards is likewife reduc'd, and Eighteen Men have been broke out of each Company. On the 26th Baron Perone, Ambassador in Ordinary from the King of Sicily, had an Audience of his Majesty.
