

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS FROM THE NATIONAL LOANS FUND

NOTICE

The Treasury in pursuance of section 5 of the National Loans Act 1968 (as amended) hereby give notice that on or after 30th October 1989:

- (i) Different rates of interest shall apply according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);
- (ii) The lowest rates of interest satisfying the conditions laid down in section (3) of the said section 5 shall be:

MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971, SECTION 13

Direction Prohibiting Exercise of Powers in Relation to Controlled Drugs

Dr John Schofield

In accordance with section 16(2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State gave the following direction which came into force on 16th October 1989.

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of subsection (2) of section 13 of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, and in accordance with section 14 of that Act, by this direction prohibits Dr John Schofield, a doctor within the meaning of that Act, whose registered address is Wyther Lodge, 185 Victoria Road, Cleveleys, Blackpool from prescribing, administering and from authorising the administration and supply of any controlled drug within the meaning of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 which was on 28th February 1989 such a controlled drug.

This direction does not extend to the doing of anything in circumstances where it may be lawfully be done without being a doctor.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes, subject to the granting of planning permission, to make an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping-up of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development to be carried out.

The proposed Order requires the provision of a new footpath, which will be a highway maintainable at the public expense, and for which Clwyd County Council shall be the highway authority.

During the 28 days from 3rd November 1989, copies of the draft Order and the relevant plan may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the Post Office, Llysfaen, Colwyn Bay, Clwyd.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days any person may by notice to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting reference ZC510-5-1-3), object to the making of the Order. In the preparation of any objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

If there are any objections to the proposal, the Secretary of State intends that it should be the subject of a Public Local Inquiry to be held consecutive to and immediately following the Local Inquiry to be held at Llysfaen Village Hall, Llysfaen on Tuesday 5th December 1989, at 10.00 a.m. into the appeal by ARC Powell Duffryn Limited against the decision of Clwyd County Council to refuse planning permission for an extension to the existing limestone quarrying operations at Llanddulas Quarry, Llanddulas, Clwyd.

The highway to be stopped up is a length of footpath at Llanddulas Quarry, near Colwyn Bay in the county of Clwyd which extends from a point 5 metres east of the stile located 153 metres south of the quarry gate at the end of the track providing access to Plas Farm to a point 118 metres east of the entrance to the track affording access to Plas Farm house and buildings, a distance of 267 metres. The Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road (A489) (Mochdre Roundabout, Newtown) Order 1989

The Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road (A489) (Mochdre Roundabout, Newtown Side Roads) Order 1989

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made the following Orders:

1. an Order under sections 10 and 12 of the Highways Act 1980 providing:

(a) that a road about 425 metres in length which he proposes to construct at Mochdre Roundabout, Newtown in the County of Powys shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and

(b) that the length of the Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Powys (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic; and

2. an Order under sections 12, 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
- (b) to stop-up highways,
- (c) to construct new highways,
- (d) to stop-up private means of access to premises, and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises,

all at Mochdre Roundabout, Newtown aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Powys as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.
