HE following Address from Virginia, was prefented to Her Majesty by the Rt. Hon. the Earl of Orkney.

To the QUEEN's most Excellent Majesty. The humble Address of the Council and Burgesses of Virginia.

May it please Your Majesty, W E Tour Majesty's most Loyal and Dutiful Subjects, the Council and Burgesses of Virginia met togetber in Assembly, do take the first Op-portunity to Felicitate Your Majesty upon the late Glorious and Happy Peace, in which You have not only procured vast Advantages to Your own Dominions, but by a most extensive Goodness bave also Consulted the Interest and Safety of Your Allies. Never did the British Troops obtain so many Triumpbs, as while Tour Majesty thought it Necessary for the Safety of Europe to make War : And never did the British Councils gain fo just a Reputation, as fince, in Compassion to the Miseries of Mankind, You have judg'd it time to make Peace. It is an Honour peculiar to Tour Majesty, that as Tour Enemies have for many Campaigns confess'd the Force of Your Arms, they now acknowledge Your Justice, by fubmitting the Pretensions of the Allies to Tour Majesty's wise Decision.

If Tour Enemies then, Madam, are so ready, in fpight of all the Difgraces they have receiv'd, to own Your Royal Virtues, who amongst Your Subjects can be filent on fo Glorious an Occasion, when, by Tour Majesty's prosperous Efforts, the Balance of Power is setled, the Liberties of Europe recovered, the fwelling Ambition of France shat up within its pro-per Bounds, the Protestant Succession to Your own Kingdoms secured, the Trade of Your People en-larged, and a safe and bonourable Peace concluded. Thus Tour Majesty has at last, by the Bleffing of the Almighty, compassed the great and just Ends for which You enter d into the War, and for which Tour faithful Subjects, with a Chearfulness beyond all Example, have supported the Expense and Calamities

of it. The' there be none of Your Majesty's People who have suffer'd more in the Ruin of their Irade, and in the Decay of their Staple Commodity than Your Sector of the Dominion: set the Glory Your Loyal Subjects of this Dominion; yet the Glory Tour Majesty bas gain'd during the War, and the prospect of a happy Peace, has made them forget their Misfortunes. In the midft of Poverty we are sensible of the many Bleffings of Tour Reign, and particularly have reason to thank Tour Majesty in the humblest manner for Your great Goodnefs, in fending us fo wife and just a Lieutenant Governor, who was not only industrious to fecure us in time of War, but does affift us to improve the Arts of Peace, and will, we hope, recommend us to Your Royal Favour, whose Glory it is to Reign in the Hearts of Your People, and be a Nursing-Mother to all Tour Subjects.

May the Great God, who is the King of Kings, and by whom Princes Reign, preferve Your Majely's precious Life for many Years; may You long continue, the Dread of Your Enemies, and the Happiness of Your own People, as You will certainly be the Ornament of History, and the Wonder and Example of all Posterity.

Berlin, Januarg 27. N. S. The two Battas lions of Dhona and Heyden, which ferv'd on the Rhine last Campaign, arriv'd here a few Days ago, and are to continue in Garrison at this Place du ring the reft of the Winter. The King review'd them on the 24th, after which His Majefty return-ed to Potfdam. Major General Lillien having exs cufed himfelf from accepting the Place of Commandant of this City, the King has disposed of it to Monsieur Forcade, Colonel of the Royal Regiment of Foot. Tho' His Majesty did not think fit to hear what the Deputy who was fent hither by the States of Cleves had to propose, he has appointed Mon-fieur Sluter, one of our Burghermasters to go thither, and to examin into the Conduct of those to whole care the Administration of Justice, and the Management of the Revenues in that Country is committed. Orders are given to all the Houfe keepers in this City to bring in a Lift every Month of all the Perfons in their Families.

Hamburgh, January 30. N. S. The number of Perfons that dy'd laft Week amounts to One hun-dred and Six. The Imperial Minister here is faid to have receiv'd an account, that the Preliminaries of Peace between the Emperor and France, were Sign'd on the 15th Instant at Radstad, which is like-wife confirmed by Letters from Paris. But the Articles are not yet known, and it is faid they will be kept private, till they have been Ratify'd by the Emperor and the most Christian King. Baron Goertz is arriv'd at Hanover, very much displeased at the Proceedings of the Court of Berlin. His Pruffian Majesty has order'd the Saxon Troops to be paid Two hundred thousand Crowns which were pro-mis'd them upon the Surrender of Stetin. Several Couriers have pass'd of late between Hanover and Copenhagen, and it is faid those two Courts are upon the Point of concluding a first Alliance. Count Goloffkin, Chancellor of Muscovy, is Chief of the Commission appointed to examin into Prince Men-zikoff's Conduct in Pomerania.

Paris, February I. N. S. On the 28th paft, a Courier was difpatch'd to Raditad with his Maje-fly's Anfwer to the Proposals of Peace made by Prince Eugene, which were transmitted hither fome time ago. The King affilts often in Council, which is at prefent employ'd in correcting feveral Abules in the Management of the Revenue. Laft Week an Express arrived from Madrid with an account, that the Queen of Spain was dangeroully ill, and that his Catholick Majefty defir'd fome able Phyfician might be fent from hence to attend her. Monfigur Helvetius was accordingly order'd thither, and he is now on his way to Madrid. We have been fince inform'd by a later Express from thence, that her Majesty was something better. The Sieurs Buys and Gollinga, Ambafladors Extraordinary from the States General, arrived here two Days ago. Since the Carnaval began, there have been feveral Comodies, Balls, and Masquerades at the Dutchess of Berry's, and the Dutchefs of Mayne's. The Ele-Aor of Bavaria, who is here Incognito, has been prefent at most of those Entertainments.

Hague, February 2. N. S. The Prince, of Hol-ftein-Beck, Governor of the Town of Ypres, is ar-rived from thence. The States-General have conferred the Command of the Prince of Mailricht, with its Dependances, upon Colonel Jaflaude Lettens from Raditad-bring an Account, that Prince Eugene and Marefchal Villars are in daily Expectation of
