Warsaw, January 20. N. S. The Nobility of this Kingdom appear very much discontented at the Expence they are put to for Maintaining the Saxon Troops, and Deputies are arrived here from several Palatinates, to complain of the Disorders they commit in their Quarters: Whereupon General Janus, their Commander in Chief, and President of the Commission appointed by King Augustus to remedy those Complaints, has published Circular Letters, in which he sets forth, that the King having been oblig'd to bring in Saxon Troops as Auxiliaries for the Defence of the Republick, he was inform'd that they exacted Contributions by force. In order therefore to put a stop to those Violences, he had writ to their Officers to make them observe an exact Discipline, and not suffer them to take away any thing without paying ready Money for it; that such Persons as transgress'd this Order should be Apprehended and carried before the next Officer; and if the Number of Offenders was too great to be laid hold of, that he should be made acquainted with it, and he would immediately cause exemplary Justice to be done upon them. Count Denhoff is gone from hence to assist at the Diet of Opatow, and the Great Treasurer of the Crown to that of Prussia, which is to be held at Graudents. The Muscovite Troops continue their March very slowly. On the 29th past Prince Dailhoruki arrived at Vilna with Ten thousand Men, where he Quarter'd there for some Days. Prince Rapnin and General Bayer are marching with the Forces under their Command towards Smolensko. We have received advice from Caminie, that some Persons of Distinction of King Stanislaus's Party had made their Submission to King Augustus; but that two Colonels, who intended to do the same, were Arrested by Order of the Seraskier Bacha. The same Letters add, that the Palatin of Masovia, our Ambassador at the Port, had follow'd the Grand Signor to Constantinople, where he was promised he should be admitted to an Audience, which he had not yet been able to obtain; and as the Turkish Ministers had not return'd any Answer to the Proposals he had made them, it was still uncertain what Measures they intended to take.

Madrid, January 29. N. S. The Queen continuing still very much out of Order, fresh Horses are laid on the Road for the Physician who is expected from Paris, and others are sent for out of Arragon and Piedmont. His Majesty has dispos'd of the Employment of Major of Saragossa, to Colonel Guffman, who lost his right Arm at the Attack of Campo Mayor. The Marquis de Thouy, and the Marquis



de Flavacourt, are gone from hence to command a Body of Men that is forming near Lerida. We have receiv'd advice from Catalonia, that Count Montemar was sent by the Duke de Napoli, with a Detachment of his Army to quell the Infurrection in the Plains of Vich, and the Inhabitants having drawn their Forces together to oppose the Count de Fiennes at the Passage of Cabrera, Count Montemar in the mean time entred the Plains at that of St. Golgat without any Resistance, and drove the Rebels from Vich, where they had kept Don Feliciano de Bracamonte closely block'd up. The Count pursu'd them with all possible diligence, and attack'd them in an advantageous Post, which he forc'd, killing Two hundred, and taking Four hundred Prisoners. Afterwards he drove another Body of them from the Mountain of St. Hippolit, plunder'd and burnt the Village and the adjacent Places. He is now marching to the Relief of Don Joseph de Vallejo, whose Forces being divided for the more effectual blocking up of the Garrison of Cardona, the Catalonians assembled in great Numbers, invested them in their Quarters, and prevented them from joining again. The Count de Fiennes had sent a considerable Detachment to Esquerol to disperse the Rebels thereabouts, but they fled away before the Troops were arriv'd. On the 19th, the Fleet from Alicant came into Terragona, and Sail'd again on the 22d for Barcelona, in order to besiege that Place by Sea.

Dunkirk, Feb. 18. N. S. Yesterday being Her Majesty's Birth-day, was celebrated with a triple Discharge of the Artillery in the Cittadel, and all the Troops in Garrison here, being drawn out between the Nieuport and Havre Ports, fired three Rounds of Small-shot. The Magistrates, who express'd their Zeal upon this Occasion by a Firework on the Place Royal, together with the principal French Officers, were Entertain'd at the Governor's House, by Sir James Abercrombie, Commandant of the Place. There were Illuminations throughout the whole Town, and the Evening concluded with a Ball in the Townhouse, at which there was a great Appearance of Persons of Distinction.
