**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980** 

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Diversion at Deep Dyffryn, Mountain Ash) (A4059 Abercynon to Beacons Reservoir Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1989.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above Order which was made by the Mid Glamorgan County Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

(a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;

- (b) to stop up highways;
- (c) to construct new highways;
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council are proposing to construct between the A4059 New Road and the junction of New Road and Ffrwd Crescent, Mountain Ash.

Copies of the Order as confirmed and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff and at the Welsh Office, Legal Division, Cathays Park, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 22nd January 1990, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
