(10) The City of Southampton (Weight Restrictions) Order 1990 Effect of the Order

1. The effect of the Order is to approve the conversion from

imperial units to metric units of existing restrictions.

- 2. The existing 6 feet 6 inches width restriction at Weston Estate, Tickleford Drive and Anglesea Road will be restricted only to vehicles of a laden gross weight not exceeding 7.5 tonnes.

(12) The City of Southampton (Mayflower Road/Leighton Avenue)
(Experimental) Order 1990

Effect of the Order

The effect of this Order will be to:-

- Prohibit motor vehicles from using the access road between Mayflower Road and Leighton Road and Leighton Avenue with an exception for local authority vehicles, statutory undertakers' vehicles, emergency vehicles and pedal cycles.
- undertakers' vehicles, emergency vehicles and pedal cycles.

  (2) To introduce lengths of "No Waiting at Any Time" as follows:

  (i) on both sides of Mayflower Road from the south-western closed end of Mayflower Road north-eastwards for a distance of 15 metres;
  - (ii) at the south-western closed end of Mayflower Road for its entire length;

- (iii) on the north-east side of Leighton Avenue from the south-eastern closed end of Leighton Avenue north-westwards for a distance of 15 metres;
- (iv) on the south-west side of Leighton Avenue from the south-eastern closed end of Leighton Avenue north-westward for a distance of 18.5 metres;
- (v) at the south-eastern closed end of Leighton Avenue for its entire length.

Implementation date

These Orders will come into operation on 25th January 1990 except for part (6)(ii)(f) relating to waiting restrictions in Bassett Close which will come into operation on 25th June 1990.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or of any of the provisions contained within on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that a requirement of that Act or regulations made under it have not been complied with, may, within 6 weeks from the date the Orders were made apply for this purpose to the High Court.
