The Stopping up of Highways (Station Road, Clydach, Gwent) Order 1990

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made the above Order under Section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the highway described in the Schedule to this Notice to enable development to be carried out.

Copies of the Order may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of Blaenau Gwent Borough Council, Municipal Offices, Civic Centre, Ebbw Vale.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or
(b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act. He may within 6 weeks of 31st January 1990 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(all distances are approximate)

The length of highway to be stopped up is at Clydach in the County of Gwent and is the verge on the western side of the carriageway of the highway known as Station Road which from a point 48 yards south west of the junction of Station Road with the A465 in a general south westerly direction to a point 46 yards north east of Pant Glas Bridge, excluding a 2 metre wide strip at the side of the carriageway.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, to authorise the diversion of a length of non-classified County Road/Bridleway No. 55 Peak Forest at Eldon Hill Quarry, near Sparrowpit, Derbyshire to enable development consisting of mineral extraction by opencast mining to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Derbyshire Mineral Mines Ltd., by the Minister of Housing and Local Government under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1947, on land now leased by RMC Technical Services Limited.

The proposed Order will require that the new length of highway to be provided as the diversion is to be a highway maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Derbyshire County Council.
