STOCKPORT METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 277

HEATON MOOR CONSERVATION AREA AND MAULDETH ROAD CONSERVATION AREA

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council, with effect from 7th December 1989, cancelled the designation of the Heaton Moor/Mauldeth Road Conservation Area and designated parts of those areas as the Heaton Moor Conservation Area and the Mauldeth Road Conservation Area respectively having determined that the areas of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance. Copies of a plan showing the boundaries of the Conservation Areas may be inspected during normal office hours at the Enquiry Desk, Development and Town Planning Division, Greenhale House, Piccadilly, Stockport. The effect of designation is that: (i) special attention will be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the Conservation Areas and applications for development which will affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Areas, must be advertised and representations made thereon taken into account; (ii) anyone wishing to demolish a building within the Conservation Areas must first apply for Conservation Area Consent to the Local Planning Authority (certain buildings are excluded); (iii) anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop, uproot or damage any tree in the Conservation Areas must give to the Council 6 weeks notice of such intention.
