The Brighton (Meter Zone Parking Places Consolidation Order 1981) (Amendment No. 38) Order 1990

THE EPPING FOREST DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Epping Forest District (Off Street Parking Places) Order

Notice is hereby given that the Epping Forest District Council, in exercise of their powers under section 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 propose to make the above Order.

The purpose of the Order is to amend the regulations relating to the use of the Council's car and lorry parks and, in particular, to introduce a "pay and display" system of charging in the following car parks:

Buckhurst Hill: Lower Queens Road Car Park (Short Stay).

- *Epping:* Bakers Lane (East) (Short Stay); Bakers Lane (West) (Long Stay); Council Offices Car Park, 323 High Street (Short Stay—Saturday only).
- Loughton: The Drive (Short Stay); High Beech Road (Long Stay); High (South) (Short Stay); Smarts Lane (Long Stay); Traps Hill (Long Stay).
- Ongar: Bansons Lane (Long Stay); The Borough (Long Stay); Pleasance (Short Stay).
- Waltham Abbey: Cornmill (Long Stay); Darby Drive (Long Stay); Quaker Lane (Short Stay).
- Charges: The charges applicable for "Short Stay" car parks will be as follows: Up to one hour—10p; up to two hours—20p; up to three hours—30p; up to four hours—50p; up to six hours £1.00; over six hours £2.00.
- The charges applicable for "Long Stay" car parks will be as follows: Up to one hour 10p; up to two hours—20p; up to four hours—40p; over four hours 80p.
- Season Tickets and Excess Charge: The draft Order also provides for season tickets for the use of Long Stay Car Parks and for parking in 'season ticket only' bays in certain Short Stay Car Parks, the charges being: Annual season ticket—£145.00; Four weekly season ticket—£12.80. An excess charge of £26.00 (reduced to £10.00 for payment within 7 days) will also be levied for contraventions of the regulations such as failing to "pay and display".
- Lorry Parks: A daily charge of £1.10 is proposed for the use of the Langston Road Lorry Park.

The above Order would replace the Epping Forest District (Off Street Parking Places) Order 1988. All other car parks affected by the 1988 Order and not mentioned above would continue to operate free of charge. The charges will operate between 0800 and 1800 Mondays to Saturdays.
