It has pleafed God to blefs My Endeavours to Obtain an Honourable and Advantagious Peace for My own People, and for the greatest Part of My Allies: Nothing which I can do, shall be Wanting to render it Universal: And I Persuade My Self that; with your Hearty Concurrence. My Interpolition may at last prove pressed on My Recovery from My late Ineffectual to Compleat the Settlement of Eut disposition, and on My Coming to this tope:

In the mean while, I Congratulate with My own Subjects, that they are Delivered from a Confuming Land-War; and En-"HIS Day Her Majefty came tered on a Peace; the good Effects whereof to the House of Peers, and nothing but Intestine Divisions can Ob-
