TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Upper Derwentside Local Plan

Notice is hereby given that, on 3rd January 1990, Derby City Council adopted the above-named local plan as modified by the Council.

The deposited documents are available for inspection, free of charge, during normal office hours at each of the Offices specified above.

The plan became operative on 3rd January 1990, but if any person aggrieved by the plan desires to question its validity on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by Part II of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or that any requirement of the said Part II or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the adoption of the plan, he may, within 6 weeks from 20th February 1990, make an application to the High Court under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

NEW TOWNS ACTS

Compulsory Purchase of Land in Stantonbury Milton Keynes

Notice is hereby given that, the Milton Keynes Development Corporation on 6th February 1990, made the Milton Keynes Development Corporation Stantonbury Compulsory Purchase Order 1990 No. 1 under section 10(1)(a) of the New Towns Act 1981. They have submitted this Order to the Secretary of State for the

Environment for confirmation, and if confirmed, the Order will authorise them to purchase compulsorily the land described in the Schedule below for the purpose of the development of the New Town of Milton Keynes.

2. A copy of the Order and of the accompanying map may be seen at all reasonable hours at Saxon Court, 502 Avebury Boulevard, Central Milton Keynes.

3. Any objection to the Order must be made in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1 2EB, before 16th March 1990 and should state the title of the Order and the grounds of objection.

4. The Secretary of State is not required in every case to arrange for a public local inquiry to be held or for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that any objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made, as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

5. Any owner or occupier of any of the land to which the Order relates may (whether or not he makes an objection to the Order) send to Milton Keynes Development Corporation a request in writing that, in the event of the Order being confirmed by the Secretary of State, he be served with a notice stating that the Order has been confirmed and naming a place where a copy of the Order and of the map or maps and any descriptive matter annexed thereto may be seen. Any such request must state the name and postal address of the owner or occupier making it, must state the nature of his interest in the land and must include sufficient particulars to enable the extent and boundaries of his land to be identified.
