BOLTON METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Bolton (Chorley Road/Church Street Westthoughton) (Prohibition of Waiting) (No. 12) Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that the Borough Council of Bolton have made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of this Order which will become operative on 7th March 1990 is as follows:

Prohibition of Waiting at All Times

- Chorley Road*, north-east side, from Church Street for 50 metres in a north-westerly direction;
- Chorley Road*, south-west side, from Church Street for 32 metres in a north-westerly direction;
- Church Street*, west side, from Chorley Road for a distance of 25 metres in a southerly direction;
- Church Street*, east side, from Manchester Road for 20 metres in a southerly direction.

(This Order will contain exceptions to permit waiting for certain purposes and limited waiting by disabled persons' vehicles).

BRIGHTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Brighton (Old Town Area) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1989 (Amendment No. 1) Order 1990

The Brighton (East Street) (One Way Traffic) Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that on 28th February 1990 the Brighton Borough Council acting as agents for East Sussex County Council made the above Orders under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as they affect East Street, Brighton, the effect of which is as follows:

- (1) Prohibition of driving in that part of the western carriageway in East Street adjoining Nos. 27-38 inclusive;
- (2) Prohibition of driving in that part of East Street from a point 13 metres south of the southern kerb-line of Steine Lane to a line adjoining the northern kerb-line of Bartholomews and a point on the eastern kerb-line of East Street 3 metres south of the southern side of Avenue except for:
 - (a) delivering or collecting goods or merchandise or for loading or unloading at premises immediately adjoining and only accessible from those roads;
 - (b) for using the off-street parking facilities immediately adjoining and only accessible from those roads;

(c) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to those lengths of roads;

(d) the removal of any obstruction to traffic in those lengths of roads;

(f) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to those lengths of roads of any sewer or of any mains pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telegraphic line as defined by the Telegraphic Act 1878.

Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 5th March 1990, and a map showing the roads effected may be examined at the Enquiry Office, Town Hall, Brighton between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Orders or any of the provisions contained in them on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, you may, within 6 weeks from today's date, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
