



Other warlike Preparations were making near Salonica. A Fleet was likewise fitting out in the Archipelago, and it was thought would be ready to set sail about the middle of May, tho' it was not certainly known upon what Design, but supposed to be in Favour of the King of Sweden, whose Interests the Ottoman Port seems very zealous to promote.
