Hereas the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in VV Parliament Affembled, have, by their humble Addrefs, befought Us, That We would be Graciously Pleased to Isue our Royal Proclamation, with a Promise therein of such a Reward, as We should, in Our Royal Wisdom, think fit, to any Person who shall Discover, and make due Proof against the Author or Authors of a False, Malicious, and Fastious Libel, Intituled, The Publick Spirit of the Whigs, set forth in their Generous Encouragement of the Author of the Crisis: With some Observations on the Seasonableness, Candor, Erudition, and Style of that Tractife, highly Dishonourable and Scanda-lous to Our Subjects of Scotland, tending to the Destruction of the Constitution, and (by making False and Unjust Resestions upon the Uniou, and the Steps and Motives to it) most Injurious to Us; as also that We would Promise therein Our most Gracious Pardon to such Person or Persons as shall make such Discovery, of all Crimes and Misdemeanors commit-ted in relation to the Printing, Publishing, and Dis-persing the said Libel: We therefore, out of Our pering the jaid Libel: We therefore, out of Our earn-st Desire to have the Author of Authors of the said Libel Discovered and brought to Justice, have readily Inclined thereunto, and do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, Graciously Promise, That if any Perfon shall Discover, and make due Proof against the Author or Authors of the said Libel, such Person shall receive from Us a Reward of the Sum of Three hundred Pounds, which Our High Treasurer is here. bundred Pounds, which Our High Treasurer is bereby directed to Pay accordingly, and also the Person or Persons, making such Discovery, shall have Our most Gracious Pardon of all Crimes and Misdemeans committed in relation to the Printing, Publishing, and Dispersing the said Libel.
