SCHEDULE PART 1

Rights of way to be suspended

1. Part of Footpath No. 1 in the Parish of Huntwick with Foulby and Nostell which runs from a point on the boundary with Sharlston Parish about 43 metres west of Foulby Farm Cottage in a general southerly direction to a point at the boundary with Hemsworth Parish about 100 metres west of Horncastle Farm. Being that part which runs from a point about 60 metres south of the said Foulby Farm Cottage in a general southerly direction to the northern boundary of the former Nostell Colliery lagoons area. Being that part which extends from a point about 110 metres south of the Nostell Miners Welfare Sports Club for a distance of about 450 metres to its termination.

3. From its junction with Footpath Sharlston No. 12 about 130 metres south west of Foulby Farm Cottage in a general south-easterly direction to Nostell Upper Lake turning to a general south-westerly direction around the lake and continuing in a general south-easterly direction passing to the southwest of the Nostell Colliery Pithead and parallel to the colliery access road to its junction with Swine Lane at Stone Cottages, then in a general south-westerly direction parallel to Swine Lane to a point on that road about 105 metres north east of Station Cottages.
