ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

CROYDON LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Croydon (Prescribed Routes) (No.) Traffic Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Croydon propose to make the above mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order would be, in connection with the improvement and dualling of the carriageways of the Purley Way in the vicinity of the new "Water Palace" development and the installation of traffic signal control at the junctions of Waddon Way/Imperial Way and the entrance to Water Palace, to:

(a) revoke;

(i) the banned right turn from Purley Way into the gap in the central reservation opposite the north-western arm of Imperial Way; and

(ii) the compulsory left turn from the north-western arm of Imperial Way into Purley Way.

- (b) require any vehicle proceeding in any length of carriageway described in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this notice to travel in the direction specified in relation to that length of road in column 2 of the said Schedule.
- (c) require any vehicle proceeding in a length of carriageway specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 to this notice, on reaching the point specified in relation to that length of road in column 2 of the said Schedule, to proceed in the direction specified in column 3 of the said Schedule.

(d) prohibit any vehicle from turning left;

(i) into Purley Way from the carriageway lying immediately north of the southern Waddon Way island site, and

(ii) into Purley Way from the carriageway lying immediately south of the northern Imperial Way island site.

(e) prohibit any vehicle from turning right;

(i) from the carriageway which lies immediately west of the eastern kerb-line of Purley Way at a point opposite the northern kerb-line of the Water Palace access road,

(ii) from the carriageway which lies immediately east of the western kerb-line of Purley Way at a point opposite the southern kerb-line of the Water Palace access road,

(iii) from the southbound carriageway of Purley Way into the southernmost slip road.

(f) prohibit any vehicle from carrying out a "U" turn;

(i) at the northern extremity of the north central reservation.

(ii) at the northern extremity of the south central reservation,

(iii) at the southern extremity of the southernmost island site,

(iv) at the southern extremity of the northern splitter island,

(v) at the northern extremity of the northern splitter island.

The restrictions and prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 above would not apply to;

(i) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;

(ii) anything done in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.
