## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT

*The A167 Trunk Road (Hill House Farm, Aycliffe) (Prohibition of use of gap in Central Reservation) Order 1990*

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notices that he has made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A167) at Aycliffe, in the District of Sedgfield in the County of Durham.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 15th May 1990, is to prohibit any vehicle proceeding in either of the carriageways of the trunk road from entering or proceeding through the gap in the central reservation of that length of the A167 opposite its junction with the farm access to Hill House Farm, Aycliffe, in the District of Sedgfield in the county of Durham.

Any person wishing to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any Instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the 15th May 1990, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

## THE IMPORTATION OF BOVINE SEMEN REGULATIONS 1984

*England General Import Licence No. 90/BS/1*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food by this licence issued under the Importation of Bovine Semen Regulations 1984, hereby authorises the importation into England, in accordance with the conditions set out overleaf.

This licence is valid for imports of deep frozen bovine semen collected and processed in a Member State from 1st January 1990, until varied or revoked by the Minister.

This licence comes into force with effect from 1st July 1990.

*Conditions for the importation of deep frozen semen collected and processed on or after 1st January 1990, under General Licence*

1. All landings of semen shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Importation of Bovine Semen Regulations 1984 and with the following provisions of this licence.
2. Each consignment of semen shall be accompanied by an animal health certificate in accordance with Council Directive 88/407/EEC as amended by Council Directive 90/120/EEC (published in Official Journals No. L194 of 22nd July 1988 and No. L71 of 17th March 1990 respectively), signed by an official veterinarian of the exporting country.
3. Each consignment semen shall be transported in a flask sealed in the presence of the certifying veterinary officer.

4. The flask shall be clearly marked with the name and address of the dispatching AI centre and the number(s) of the animal health certificate referred to at 2 above.

5. The animal health certificate must be presented on entry to Her Majesty's Customs and Excise for checking and endorsement and then accompany the consignment to its final destination \*where it should be retained.

NOTE: This licence applies only to consignments of deep frozen bovine semen collected and processed in Member States of the European Community on or after 1st January 1990. Any person wishing to import deep frozen bovine semen collected and processed before 1st January 1990, should apply for a specific import licence to the appropriate address below.

\*NB: The licence does not provide any exemption from the Artificial Insemination of Cattle (Animal Health) (England and Wales) Regulations 1985 or the Artificial Insemination of Cattle (Animal Health) (Scotland) Regulations 1985.

## PETROLEUM AND SUBMARINE PIPE-LINES ACT 1975

*Notice of the Issue of a Submarine Pipe-Line Works Authorisation*

The Secretary of State for Energy hereby gives notice, that he has decided to issue, and in consequence has issued, a works authorisation to Phillips Petroleum Company United Kingdom Limited, whose address is Phillips Quadrant, 35 Guildford Road, Woking, Surrey GU22 7QT, for the construction of a 6 inch pipe-line between the Moira Wellhead and the Maureen Platform.

Except with the consent of the Secretary of State, the 6 inch pipe-line shall only be used to convey crude oil and the 2 inch pipe-line shall only be used to convey lift gas.

The pipelines may be used by the holder and with the holder's agreement and, with the consent of the Secretary of State, by other persons.

Phillips Petroleum Company United Kingdom Limited has been appointed operator of the pipe-line.

*Notice of the Issue of a Submarine Pipe-Line Works Authorisation*

Except with the consent of the Secretary of State, the 16 inch pipe-line shall only be used to convey dry gas.

The pipe-line may be used by the holder and with the holder's agreement and, with the consent of the Secretary of State, by other persons.

Mobil North Sea Limited has been appointed operator of the pipe-line.
