## ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

#### **BEVERLEY BOROUGH COUNCIL**

The East Yorkshire Borough of Beverley Borough Council (Gladstone Street, Hessle) (Prohibition of Waiting and Parking Places) Order 1990.

Notice is hereby given that the East Yorkshire Borough of Beverley Borough Council acting as agent for Humberside County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which will be:

(a) to prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time in parts of the following roads:

Gladstone Street, Hessle, east side from a point 15 metres north of the northern kerb-line of Ferriby Road in a northerly direction to its junction with Salisbury Street except in authorised parking spaces.

(b) to create parking places in Gladstone Street, Hessle with waiting limited to one hour with return prohibited within one hour between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive (with an exemption for vehicles of residents of Gladstone Street displaying a valid permit for the parking places).

Exemptions to the above will include permission to wait for the purposes of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading, the maintenance of roads, gas, water and electricity supplies and for fire, police and ambulance purposes.

A copy of the draft Order, the relevant plans and a statement of the council's reasons for proposing to make the Order are available for inspection at The Hall, Lairgate, Beverley between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Friday (except Bank Holidays). ### **DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL**

The County of Devon (High Street and Church Street, Cullompton)
(Ambulance Bay and Loading Bay and Prohibition of Waiting)
Order 1990.

#### LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Lincolnshire County Council (Various Roads, Gedney Drove End) (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 199 (Various Roads, Long Sutton) (Restricted Roads and 40 m.p.h Speed Limit) Order 199.

Notice is hereby given that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make Orders under sections 82(2), 83(2) and 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to impose the following speed restrictions in Gedney Drove End and Long Sutton:

#### Gedney Drove End 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit

B1359, from its junction with Marsh Road/Dawsmere Road in a north-westerly direction for a distance of about 765 metres;

Marsh Road, from its junction with the B1359/Dawsmere Road in a south-easterly direction for a distance of about 525 metres;

Dawsmere Road, from its junction with Marsh Road/B1359 in a north-westerly direction for a distance of about 665 metres.

#### Long Sutton 30 m.p.h. Speed Limit

Station Road, from the existing terminal point (about 10 metres north of its junction with The Delph) in a southerly direction for a distance of about 25 metres (to include The Delph cul de sac).

### 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit

Seagate Road, from a point about 110 metres south of its junction with London Road, southwards to its junction with the A17;

Station Road/Cowpers Gate, from a point about 15 metres south of the junction with The Delph southwards to the roundabout at the junction with the A17;

Wisbech Road (B1395), from the highway boundary of the eastern junction with Bridge Road, southwards to the roundabout at the junction with the A17.

A copy of the proposed Orders and a plan showing the lengths of road concerned with a statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders may be inspected at County Offices, Lincoln and the offices of the South Holland District Council, Priory Road, Spalding during normal office hours.

Increase in Parking Meter Charges
