#### TENDERS FOR STERLING TREASURY BILLS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 22nd June 1990 at 1 p.m. for Sterling Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £500,000,000 for Bills due 91 days after date and £200,000,000 for Bills due 182 days after date.

The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, 25th June 1990 to Friday, 29th June 1990, inclusive.

The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (Being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates and different tenors.

Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office.

Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Securities Office, Bank of England. Particular forms are available for Bills of each maturity.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders.

THE NEW TOWN OF TELFORD

*Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way at Hill Top Village, Old Park—Footpath 51 and Bridleway 50*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of his powers under Section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981 proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over the following routes shown coloured red on the map referred to therein.

That length of footpath starting at a point marked "A" on the map (located immediately in front of number 49 Park Lane) and running in a north westerly direction for a distance of approximately 115 metres to a point marked "B" on the map (located approximately 40 metres south west of the junction of Park Lane and the cul-de-sac serving The Coppice, Hill Top Village).

That length of bridleway 50 starting at a point marked "B" on the map (located approximately 40 metres south west of the junction of Park Lane and the cul-de-sac serving The Coppice, Hill Top Village) and running in a north easterly direction for a distance of approximately 30 metres to a point marked "C" on the map (located approximately 10 metres west from the junction of Park Lane and the cul-de-sac serving The Coppice, Hill Top Village).

A map showing the rights of way proposed to be extinguished and the alternative route which is available may be inspected at the offices of the Telford Development Corporation, New Town House, Telford Square, Town Centre, Telford, Shropshire, TF3 4JS during normal office hours. Any objection to the proposal must be made in writing clearly stating all the grounds of the objection and addressed to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Room P2/153, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB, not later than 24th July 1990.
