#### THE PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) (SEAWARD AREAS) REGULATIONS 1988

The Secretary of State for Energy invites applications, in accordance with the Petroleum (Production) (Seaward Areas) Regulations 1988 (SI 1988 No. 1213), as amended by the forthcoming Petroleum (Production) (Seaward Areas) (Amendment) Regulations 1990 (in this notice called "the Regulations"), for petroleum production licences in respect of the blocks specified in the Schedules to this notice and delineated on maps deposited in the Library at the Department of Energy, 1 Palace Street, London SW1E 5HE. The maps may be inspected by prior appointment (telephone no. 071-238 3042) between 0915 and 1645 hours Monday to Friday until 12th December 1990 for those blocks listed in Schedule 1 below and until 15th January 1991 for the tranches of blocks listed in Schedule 2.

#### Consideration for and Conditions of Licences

- 2. (a) Licences issued on standard terms.
  - Licences issued in respect of blocks listed in Schedule 1 will have an initial term of six years with a second term of twelve years. This second term may be extended beyond twelve years for a further period of eighteen years. These licences will be subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 4 to the Regulations.
  - (b) Licences issued on Frontier Area terms.
  - Licences issued in respect of tranches of blocks listed in Schedule 2 will have an initial term of nine years with a second term of fifteen years. This second term may be extended beyond fifteen years for a further period of twenty-four years. These licences will be subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 4 to the
