The King has granted him a Perfion of Ten thousand Crowns a Year, which is equal to the Salary hereeeived as Prefident of Castile. Hanover, May 1. N. S. Letters from Conftan-tinople bring an Account, that the King of Sweden being informed at Demotica of the Conclusion of the Peace between the Emperor and France, had defired leave of the Grand Signior to return into his own Dominions. To which the Grand Vizir made answer, That the Port had several times offered to fend him away with a fufficient Force to guard him to his own Kingdom, and he had always refused to take any way that had been proposed to him, but if he would now declare in what manner he would go, they would confider of it, and he should receive an Answer very soon. King Staniflaus had likewife follicited the Port by his Minister for liberty to depart from Bender, and to retire into Tranfilvania, but he was told it could not be granted, because they were informed his defign was to go into Poland, which was contrary to the Treaty they had made with the Polish Ambassador. The fame Advices inform us, that the Governor of Da-mascus persisted still in his Rebellion, and was joined by a great number of Malecontents, tho' four of the principal Bachas in Afia had been fent against

him with a powerful Army. Hamburgb, May 4. N. S. The King of Denmark has deferr'd his Journey to Holftein for fome time longer than he had at first intended, and it is not yet known when he will fet out for that Country. The Danish Court continues still very uneasie upon the King of Prullia's Proceedings, notwithstanding the repeated Assurances which have been given by his Ministers, that his Majesty is of Opinion all Matters relating to the Houfe of Gottorp, fhould be referr'd to the Congress of Brunswick. Part of the Danish Troops that ferv'd in Flanders during the last War, are already arrived in the Dutchy of Bremen, and those which are Quarter'd there before, are marching towards Gopperheide, It is computed his Majefty will affemble an Army of at least Thirty fix thousand Men, but it's thought he will only observe the Motions of the Court of Prussia, and not undertake any Action, tho' he has been been very much prefs'd by the Czar to be-gin the Operations against Sweden. It is faid the King of Denmark is willing to conclude a Treaty of Peace with Sweden and Holstein upon the following Conditions. He offers to reflore Bremen and Verden to his Swedish Majefty, provided Sca-nia, Halland, Blecking and Bahussehm be yielded, up to him in Perpetuity, and that the Port of Carlierone and the Fortifications of Wilmar be dp-molith'd. He will likewife deliver up the Dutchies. of Slefwick and Holftein to the Duke, upon Con-, dition his Highnefs will do Homage to him for the former. He infifts, that Tonningen shall never be rebuilt; and lastly, he demands certain Territories, for the reimburfement of his Expences in the War. Bruffels, May 7. N. S. Some Days ago the Regiment of Horse of Westerlo, entertained by the Province of Brabant, was review'd upon the Efpla-nade of this Place in Prefence of the Regency, and found to be Compleat, and in good Order. On the 5th, the Dutchefs of Bifaccia, Heirefs of the Ho-nour and Effate of the Houfe of Egmont, died here after a long Sicknefs. Letters from Vienna of the 21st past bring an Account, that the Plenipoten-tiaries appointed by his Imperial Majesty to assist at the Congress of Baden, were preparing their Equipages with all poffible Expedition, in order to fet out for that Place.

Yeiterday the Earl of Strafford was in Conference with all the Protestant Ministers of the Empire, and afterwards with the Great Penfionary Heinfius. This Morning we received advice from Paris of the Death of the Duke of Berry, after an Indifpofition of four Days.
