Letters from Demotica bring an account, that the King of Sweden was preparing to return very soon into his own Dominions.

*Brussels, May 7. N. S.* Some Days ago the Regiment of Horse of Westerlo, entertained by the Province of Brabant, was review'd upon the Esplanade of this Place in Presence of the Regency, and found to be Compleat, and in good Order. On the 5th, the Dutcheß of Bifaccia, Heireß of the Honour and Estate of the House of Egmont, died here after a long Sickness. Letters from Vienna of the 21st past bring an Account, that the Plenipotentiaries appointed by his Imperial Majesty to assist at the Congress of Baden, were preparing their Equipages with all possible Expedition, in order to set out for that Place.

*Hague, April 8. N. S.* The Duke d'Offuna, Plenipotentiary of Spain, is arriv'd here from Utrecht. Yesterday the Earl of Strafford was in Conference with all the Protestant Ministers of the Empire, and afterwards with the Great Pensionary Heinsius. This Morning we received advice from Paris of the Death of the Duke of Berry, after an Indisposition of four Days.
