Westminster, May 11. ER Majesty having granted a Commission under the Great Seal, impowering the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain, the Lord President of Her Majesty's Council, and the Lord Steward of Her Majesty's Houshold, to Pass the Royal Assent, in Her Majesty's Absence, to some Bills agreed to by both Houses of Parliament; this Day the Lords Commissioners sent a Message to the House of Commons by Sir William Oldes, Gentleman Usher of the Black-Rod, to defire the House to come up to the House of Peers with their Speaker, to be present at the Passing the Bills into Acts. The Speaker and the House went up accordingly, and the Lords Commissioners Passed the Royal Affent to

Warfaw, April 28. N. S. King Augustus has fent Affurances to the Deputies of the Palatinates, by the Chancellor of the Kingdom, that he will return very foon to this City. The Primate has writ another Letter to his Majesty, desiring him to convene a general Diet, and to withdraw the Saxon Forces out of the Kingdom. But we are informed those Troops will nevertheless be sent towards the Frontiers of Podolia, in order to observe the Motions of the Turks, the Tartarians, and the Cosfacks. Some Days ago they were review'd near this Place, and General Janus, by the King's direction, commanded them to provide themselves with Vichuals and Forrage for their March. The Great General of the Crown hath received a Letter from the Governor of Caminiec, with an account, that the Garrison under his Command was in a very bad Condition, and that the new Fortifications remain ing unfinished, would be rather a Prejudice than an Advantage to the Place, in case it should be Attack'd by the Turks. Upon this advice, the Great General hath fent him a Reinforcement of two Battalions. They write from Leopol, that the number of Workmen employed in the Fortifications of Cho cim, was confiderably increas'd. Several new Houses had been built thereabouts by the Seraskier's Order, and they were bestow'd upon the Peasants, who re tired out of Podolia. Letters from Constantinople

bring an account, that the King of Sweden continued still at Demotica, and King Stanislaus at Ben-The Grand Vizir was very much incensed at the Palatin of Mazovia, our Ambassador, for refusing to fign an Article for the delivering up of Ukrain to the Ottoman Port, and had threatned the Republick with a new War upon that account, notwithstanding which, the Ambassador persisted still in his Refusal.

Venice, May 4. N. S. Monfignor Aldobrandini, the Pope's Nuntio, intends to make his Publick Entry here on the 6th with great Magnificence. Some Days ago a rich Venetian Galley, bound for Smyrna, was cast away near this Place; and we are informed three Vessels more, laden with Corn and Oyl from hence, have been lately lost in the Gulph. They write from Rome, that the Pope had chosen Signor Francisco Foscari Auditor of the Rota for this Republick. Letters from Naples bring an account, that the Earl of Peterborough was arrived there in the Greyhound Man of War from Palermo. The Vice Roy immediately fent Count Aquilaro to Compliment him upon his arrival, and to offer him an Apartment in the Palace; but his Excellency defired to be excus'd from accepting his Invitation, upon account of the short Stay he intended to make in

that City.

Leipsick, May 12. N. S. The Landgrave of Hesse Cassel arrived here two Days ago. It is supposed he is come to confer with King Augustus, upon a Treaty of Marriage between the Prince his Son. and the Princess Ulrica of Sweden. The time of his Majesty's return to Poland is still uncertain, but it is thought he will fer out about the beginning of next Month. We have received advice from thence, that there was a great Scarcity of Provisions in that Kingdom, particularly in the Palatinate of Podolia, and the Exportation of Corn had been forbidden upon that account. A confiderable Pody of Turks had pass'd the Danube with a Train of Artillery, in order to encamp near Chocim, which gave great Uncafiness to the Poles; and their Apprehensions wele very much encreased, upon advice that their Ambassador at Constantinople had made no Progress in his Negotiations. They write from Petersbourg, that the Czar continued still at that Place, and was making all possible Preparations for the Execution of his Deligns against Sweden. He had fent his Secretary to Monsieur Bassewitz, Minister of Holstein, with Orders to leave the Muscovite Territories without any delay. Letters from Turky bring an account, that the King of Sweden intended to fet out very foon from Demotica, in order to return to his own Dominions, and it was said he would pass through Poland with a Guard of Six thousand Turks.

Hamburgh, May 15. N. S. Baron Frisendorsf set out a few Days ago for Hanover, in order to make some Proposals to that Court, and from thence he is to go the Congrels of Bruntwick, where he is lent without any Character from the King of Sweden his Master, but only with a Commission fign'd by Count Welling. At his arrival there, he is to present a Memorial to Count Schonborn, defiring that the Emperor, by virtue of his Imperial Dignity, will cause the Dutchy of Bremen to be restored to his Swedish Majesty, according to the Constitution of the Empire. The Duke of Wirtem-

berg and General Scholten are expected this Evening at Gottorp, but our Advices from Copenhagen make no mention of the departure of his Danish Majesty. Monsieur Meyer, Minister of Denmark at the Court of Dresden, being inform'd that Baron Goertz was upon his way thither, has defired King Augustus to forbid him from coming, since it appoar'd by the Papers found in Tonningen, that the Administrator of Holstein had order'd that Fortress to be delivered up to Count Steinbock, whereby he had openly declared against the Allies of the North, and therefore he hoped his Majesty would not suffer any Minister of that Prince to reside in his Dominions. Letters from Petersbourg bring an account, that the Swedish Squadron which sailed some time ago from Carlscrone, had made an Attempt to burn the Czar's Fleet at Cronflot; but Count Apraxin, great Admiral of Muscovy, having received timely notice of their Design, had by that means prevent-ed it. We hear from Constantinople, that the Grand Signior hath resolved to send a. Minister to King Augustus, with Proposals of a new Treaty of Peace with his Majesty and the Republick of

Hanover, May 15. N. S. On the 12th the Elector removed from hence to Veyhausen, within three Leagues of Zell, where he intends to continue for some time, in order to take the Diversion of Hunting. The Day before his departure, Mr. Harley had an Audience of Leave of his Electoral Highness. Ye sterday he had likewise an Audience of the Electress Dowager, of the Electoral Prince and Princess, and this Day he fet out for Great Britain.
