TENDERS FOR STERLING TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 17th August 1990 at 1 p.m. for Sterling Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £500,000,000 for Bills due 91 days after date and £200,000,000 for Bills due 182 days after date.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, 20th August 1990 to Friday, 24th August 1990, inclusive.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates and different tenors.

5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office.

6. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Securities Office, Bank of England. Particular forms are available for Bills of each maturity.

7. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders. (11 SI)

The Export of Goods (Control) (Iraq and Kuwait Sanctions) Order 1990

Made 8th August 1990.

Coming into force 9th August 1990.

The Secretary of State, in exercise of powers conferred by section 1 of the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act 1939 (1939 c. 69) and now vested in him (see S.I. 1970/1537), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Export of Goods (Control) (Iraq and Kuwait Sanctions) Order 1990 and shall come into force on 9th August 1990.

(2) Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order shall have the meaning it bears in the Export of Goods (Control) Order 1989 (S.I. 1989/2376, amended by S.I. 1990/128, 735, 893 and 1588).

Prohibition on exportation to Iraq and Kuwait.

2.—(1) Subject to article 3 of this Order, all goods are prohibited to be exported from the United Kingdom to any destination in Iraq or Kuwait, or to any destination in any other country for
