Vienna, May 23. N.S.

HE Empress has been inform'd that the House the had order'd to be prepared for her at Baden, where the intends to drink the Waters, is not yet in a readine's to receive her, upon which her Majefty has put off her Journey to that Place till the Tenth of next Month. Mon-fieur Schunck, the King of Pruffia's Secretary, who was fent fome time ago with a Commiffion to this Court, is returned to Berlin. A Courier is arrived here from France, with fome Difpatches re-lating to the Congress of Baden, but the Contents of them are not yet certainly known. The Batta-tions of Bevern, Taun, and Lancken, are expected here very foon in their way to Hungary. They write from Buda, that there was a Band of Robbers affembled thereabouts, that they had put the Country under Contribution, and were grown fo numerous and powerful, that it was thought the Government would be obliged to fend a Body of regular Troops to suppress them. Letters from Turky bring an Account, that the King of Swe-den continued fill at Demir Tocca, but Prepara-tions were making for his Majesty's departure, which it was thought would be very soon, and he had determined to return through Poland into his own Dominions. The late Holpodar of Valachia was brought to Constantinople under a strong Guard, and immediately after his arrival he was

committed to Prifon. Gottorp, May 26. N. S. On the 20th General Scholten fet out for Tomingen; from whence he is fince gone to Staden, in order to review the Danifh Regiments lately arrived from the Low-Countries. The King of Denmark continues still at Frederickfbourg, and he has not yet fixed on a Day for his departure from thence. His Troops in this Country are to remain in their former Quarters till the arrival of his Majesty, who intends to review them in Perfon. Count Van der Nath, Minister of Holstein, is gone into Pomerania. Letters from Copenhagen bring an Account, that a Squadron of Seven Men of War, under the Command of Monsieur Tamsfen, was preparing to fet fail from thence, with Two of the Czar's Frigats, in order to join the Muss thought the King of Denmark's whole Fleet would be in a readines's to put to Sea in a short time,

Leipfick, May 27. N. S. On the 24th King Augustus fet out for Drefden, accompanied by Count Vitzdum, his Great Chamberlain, and feveral other Officers of the Court. Hamburgh, June 1. N. S. We are informed, That the Counts Wackerbare and Flemming are arrived at Brunswick, and it is thought the Conferences will begin very foon, unlefs his Imperial Majefty and the Allies of the North should confent to have the Congress transferr'd to some other Place, as the Swedes have defired. Monsieur de Brosse, Envoy of King Augustus at the Court of Denmark, has received Orders from his Master to return home, and no other Minister has been yet nam'd in his Place. Baron Sparr and Monfieur de Rottenbourg have made fome new Proposals to the Court of Prussia, in favour of Sweden and Holstein, but tho' they are faid to be much more advantageous than the former, it is doubted whether his Pruffian Ma-jefty will agree to them. They write from Stockholm, that an Account was brought there of an Engagement between the Swedish and Muscovite Fleets near the River Corpo, in which the former had Taken and Sunk above Thirty of their Enemies Ships, and Admiral Wattrang was preparing to At-tack them a Second Time, as foon as the Bomb-Veffels were arrived. The principal Conditions of the Treaty of Peace lately concluded between King Augustus and the Ottoman Port, are these: His Majefty and the Republick of Poland oblige themfelves to obferve the first Article of the Treaty made the 13th of June, 1713, by the Muscovite and Turkith Minilters, as far as relates to the Affairs of that Kingdom. The Grand Signior is to give proper notice to the King and Republick, in cafe his Swedish Majesty should resolve to return into his own Dominions through Poland, and Commif-fioners are to be appointed to fettle the manner of his Passage, which is to be Secure and Free, with

a Retinue fuitable to his Rank. Cologne, June 1. N.S. The Electoral Prince of Saxony went from hence this Day towards Aix la Chapelle, extreamly pleas'd with the Refpect that has been fhewn him during his continuance at this Place. There have been frequent Robberies committed of late upon the High Ways in this Electorate, but by the Diligence that has been ufed in apprehending the Maletactors, and bringing them to Juffice, it is hop'd thofe Diforders will non be at an end. The States of Munfter, that have been affembled for fome time in that City, are now feparated. It is faid the King of Pruffia intends to take fome of the Troops of Heffe Caffel into his Service. The Burgher-Mafters of the Town of Huy have made great Complaints to the Imperial Council at Liege, of their being obliged to give Lodgings in their Houfes to the Forces in Garrifon there.

Hague, June 5. N. S. On the 2d Inflant, the States of Holland and Weft-Friefeland feparated for three Weeks. Yelterday the Earl of Strafford was in Conference with the Great Penfionary, as alfo with Prince Kurakin, Ambaffador of the Czar, upon the Affairs of the North. General Hompefch is appointed to be Governor of the Town of Namur, in the room of Count Tilly, who has obtained the Government of Bois le Duc, and that of Luxembourg, is conferred upon General Keppel. Monfieur Goftinga, one of the Ambaffadors of the States General to the Court of France, is expected here very foon,
