ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984—SECTION 14

East Rochester Way, Bexley temporary closures of Westbound carriageway, contraflows and imposition of 40 m.p.h. speed restriction

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that to enable major works to be carried out on the westbound carriageway of the A2 trunk road in the London Borough of Bexley, known locally as East Rochester Way, he intends to make an Order the effect of which when the appropriate traffic signs are displayed, would be carried out in two stages and is described as follow: Stage One

- (c) The closures and reduced speed limits will be effective from 24th November 1990 until the works over the length of road described at (a)(i) above have been completed.
- (d) Displaced traffic will contrafiow one of the lanes of the eastbound carriageway.
- (e) Alternative routes for traffic wishing to use the closed road A223, will be clearly signposted.

Stage Two

(a) Closure of-

 (i) traffic lanes in the westbound carriageway of the A2 between a point opposite Number 200 Rochester Drive and a point opposite Number 1 Lakeside Close;

(ii) the exit at the Danson Interchange.

- (b) Imposition of 40 m.p.h. speed limit in the westbound traffic lanes between a point 100 metres east of the bridge over the 'Dartford Loop' railway line and a point opposite Number 30 Park Mead and in the eastbound traffic lanes between a point opposite Numbers 800 and 802 East Rochester Way and a point opposite Numbers 178 and 180 Rochester Drive.
- (c) The closures and reduced speed limit will follow the completion of stage one above until the works of stage two on the length of road described at (a)(i) above are completed.
- (d) Displaced traffic will contraflow along one of the lanes of the eastbound carriageway.
- (e) Alternative routes for traffic wishing to leave the trunk road at the closed Danson Interchange will be clearly signposted.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The Trunk Road (A46) (Coventry Eastern Bypass) (24 hour Clearway) Order 1990

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that on 5th November 1990, he made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the Bath-Coventry-Lincoln Trunk Road (A46) known as the Coventry Eastern Bypass, which will come into force on 19th November 1990 the effect of which is to:

- prohibit waiting on any part of the trunk road other than a layby except upon the direction of a police constable or a traffic warden;
- (2) prohibit waiting on any layby for the purpose of selling goods, unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.

Exceptions are provided in the order for emergency vehicles being used in connection with any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, or in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties. Also whilst any gate or barrier at the entrance to premises to which a vehicle requires to enter or from which it has emerged is opened or closed.

This Order replaces the existing temporary Order known as the Trunk Road (A46) (Coventry Eastern Bypass) (Temporary Clearway) Order 1990 which came into force on 26th February 1990.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 15th November 1990, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order, or of any provision contained therein.
