Venice, June 29. N. S.

DON Giuseppe Bolognos, President of the Council at Naples, is arrived here from thence, and intends to set out very soon for Vienna. The Marquis de Prie, late Ambassador of his Imperial Majesty at Rome, is passed thro' the Venetian Territories without coming to this City, where he was expected. They write from Mirandola, that a Flash of Lightning had fallen upon a Magazine of Gunpowder, which had blown up part of the Ducal Palace, together with some adjoining Houses, and near Three hundred Persons were crush'd to Death by the Ruins. Letters from Rome bring an account, that Cardinal Schrottenbach arrived there on the 14th. The same Day the Pope went to visit the Queen Dowager of Poland, and wish'd her Majesty a good Voyage to France. On the 16th she set out for Civita Vecchia, from whence she embark'd for Marseilles, on board one of the Pope's Gallies which waited there to receive her. Prince Alexander her Son will continue two Months longer at Rome, after which he intends to go to Breslaw. The Emperor's Ambassador had not appear'd at any publick Assembly, upon a Dispute about Precedency between him and the Governor of the City. We have received advice from Naples, that two Vessels, with Five hundred German Soldiers on Board, were arrived at Manfredonia from the Province of Istria. We have been informed by several Ships lately come in here, that a Squadron of Turkish Gallies was order'd to Cruise in the Levant, and to seize all Vessels they met of any Nation whatever, laden with Corn or Oil.

Vienna, June 30. N. S. On the 23d, King Stanislaus arrived at Burgersdorff with a Retinue of Fifty Persons, and the next Day he pursu'd his Journey to Deux Ponts, where he expects to be joined in a short time by his Swedish Majesty, who has obtained Leave of the Emperor to pass through his Dominions Incognito. Some Days ago the Prince de Taxis set out for Franckfort, and the Prince de Schwartzenberg for Bohemia. Letters from Transylvania bring an account, that the Govern-

ment of that Province had received an Express from the Hospodar of Valachia, with fresh Assurances of Friendship. They write from Leopold, that the Palatin Potoski was arrived there, and had writ a very submissive Letter to King Augustus, desiring Leave to throw himself at his Majesty's Feet. The Turks continue to employ a great number of Workmen in the Fortifications of Chocim, which are carried on with great diligence.

Berlin, July 7. N. S. On the 3d Instant, the King, accompanied by several of the Ministers, set out from Charlottenbourg for Cleves, where it is thought he will continue till the middle of next Month. The Queen is appointed to be Regent during his Majesty's absence. Some Days ago Monsieur Bassowitz arrived here from Petersbourg. Baron Goertz is returned from Hamburgh, where he had been to receive new Instructions from the Duke Administrator of Holstein his Master. Baron Spar intends to set out very soon for Baden, where he is to reside with the Character of Plenipotentiary of Sweden. At the request of the City of Magdebourg, the Regency of that Dutchy is to be transferr'd thither from Hall. They write from Stockholm, That the Swedish Fleet is so Posted, that the Muscovites cannot pass by them without coming to an Engagement.

Hamburgh, July 10. N. S. Some Days ago Monsieur Poussin, Envoy of France to the Circle of Lower Saxony, arrived here from Copenhagen. On the 28th past, the King of Denmark set out from Gottorp, in order to visit Tonningen, Gluckstad, and other Places in Holstein, after which his Majesty intends to go into the Dutchy of Bremen, and from thence to Oldenbourg. A Memorial from Count Welling, and the Swedish Regency at Staden, in the Name of the King their Master, hath been lately presented to his Imperial Majesty. It relates to the evacuation of the Dutchies of Bremen and Verden by the Danish Troops, and hath been likewise communicated to the Diet of Ausbourg by the Swedish Minister, who hath accompanied it with another of his own, desiring they may both be taken

that the just Demands of his Swedish Majesty may be supported by a favourable Decree of the Empire. Letters from Petersbourg of the 22d past, bring an Account, That the Muscovite Fleet had been detained for some time, between Jambot and Narva by contrary Winds, which being afterwards changed, the Czar pursued his Voyage, and it is supposed he is now arrived at Revel. We have received advice from Constantinople, that a Tartarian Officer had been sent from thence with Dispatches to King Augustus, and it was thought upon his return, all Matters that remain to be adjusted with the Polish Ambassador, would be immediately concluded.

Hague, July 13. N. S. On the 11th, the Earl of Strafford was in Conference with the Deputies of the States General, upon the Subject of their Barrier in the Spanish Netherlands, in relation to which, Baron Heems, the Imperial Minister had given in a Memorial the Day before. The King of Prussia is arrived at Cleves, and it is said his Majesty will come Incognito to this Place. The States General have resolved to fit out a Squadron of Men of War for the Protection of their Merchant Ships in the Baltick Sea.

London, July 5. This Day the Right Hon. the Lord Tamworth, Grandson and Heir Apparent of the Right Hon. Earl Ferrers, died of the Small Pox.
