**T**HE Prince de Radzivil, Great Chancellor of Lithuania, is arrived here from Saxony with an account, that King Augustus had resolved to set out very soon from Dresden, in order to return into this Kingdom, where his Presence is very much wanted. The Saxon Troops continue to raise great Contributions in the Palatinates where they are quarter'd, and the Discontents of the Nobility and People upon that account are very much encreased of late. The Great General of Lithuania has desired several of the Senators to meet him at Wilna, in order to consider of proper Measures to put a stop to the Exactions of those Troops in the Great Dutchy. There has been for some time a great Scarcity of Provisions at Casimir, Cracow, and other Places of this Kingdom, for which reason Guards have been posted on the Frontiers towards Prussia, to prevent the carrying of Corn into Foreign Countries. They write from Leopold, that the Palatin of Kiovia, and several other Polish Noblemen who had followed King Stanislaus into Turkey, were arrived at that Place, and had been receiv'd with great Civility by the Archbishop, and the Great General of the Crown. They were accompanied by a Tartarian Minister, who had Directions to thank King Augustus for granting their Pardon, and receiving them into Favour at the Request of the Han. Letters from Podolia bring an account, that the Palatin of Mazovia, Ambassador of the Republick to the Ottoman Port, had left Constantinople, and was upon his way to this City. We are informed, that the Turks have considerably reinforced their Troops on the Frontiers, and that the Fortifications of Chocim are still carried on with great diligence.

*Vienna, July 4. N. S.* On the 29th past Monsieur de Huldeberg, Envoy of the Elector of Brunswick, had an Audience of their Imperial Majesties, in which he notified the Death of the Electress Dowager. There have been frequent Councils held of late upon the present Conjunction of Affairs, and the Emperor has constantly assisted at them in Person. Count Guttenstein, Commander in Chief in Bohemia, is arriv'd here from Prague. The Prince of Hesse Darmstad is preparing to set out for Italy, in order to take Possession of his Government of Mantua. The Protestants in Hungary have sent Deputies to this Court, with a Complaint, that the Churches, which the Turks had given them leave to build, have been taken from them, but it is doubted their Remonstrance will have but little

Effect, since the Emperor has lately ordered all the Protestant Families, which settled there since the last Troubles, to leave the Country. Letters from Constantinople bring an account, that the King of Sweden had resolved to set out from Demotica about the middle of this Month, but his Majesty had not declared whether he would return home through Poland, or the Hereditary Dominions of the Emperor.

*Franckfort, July 12. N. S.* On the 5th Instant the Prince of Nieubourg, Great Master of the Teuto-nick Order, and Coadjutor of Mayence, arrived here from Breslaw, and on the 9th he set out for Ems, where he intends to drink the Waters. The Princes of Taxis and Lobcowitz went from hence Yesterday to Schwalback. We are informed, that King Stanislaus is arrived at Deux-Ponts, where he has been received with great Honours by Baron Stralenheim, Governour of that Dutchy. Letters from Baden bring an account, that Prince Eugene and Marechal Villars were expected there before the end of this Month. The Conferences between the Plenipotentiaries of the Emperor and the most Christian King were continued with great Assiduity. Those Ministers had received Expresses from their respective Courts with fuller Instructions than had been given them at their departure to the Congress. They write from Zurich, that an Assembly of the Swiss Cantons was to be held on the 15th Instant at Frauenfeld.
