



likewise expected about the beginning of next Month. As the most important Points in the Treaty of Peace have been already settled by Letters between these two Generals, it is thought the Congress will end in a short time after their arrival. Letters from Madrid bring an account, that Don Francisco Rodriguez de Mendarofqueta, President of the Council of Castile, had been consecrated Bishop of Siguenca, by the Patriarch of the Indies, assisted by the Bishops of Tortosa and Gironda. Letters from Catalonia had brought an account, that Monsieur Orry was returned to the Camp, in pursuance of the Orders he had received from Court. A Body of Four thousand Miquelets had made themselves Masters of the Post of St. Ypolito, and were entering into the Plains of Vich. Whereupon a Detachment was sent to oppose them under the Command of Don Feliciano de Bracamonte, who defeated them after a small Resistance, and obliged them to retire with precipitation towards the Mountains. The Inhabitants of Barcelona were in great Distress for want of Provisions and it was thought they would surrender the Place soon after the arrival of Marschal Berwick, who had been constituted General in Chief of all his Catholick Majesty's Forces, and was expected at the Camp on the 6th Instant.

*Kensington, July 19.* This Evening Signor Tron, Ambassador in Ordinary from the most Serene Republick of Venice, had his first Private Audience of Her Majesty, to which he was Introduced by the Right Hon. the Lord Viscount Bolingbroke, One of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and Conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Master of the Ceremonies.
