HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Levene Bridge to Carlisle Trunk Road (A595 Egremont By-pass) (Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 1991

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes in relation to the above mentioned Trunk Road at Egremont, in the Borough of Copeland, in the county of Cumbria to make the following Order:

An Order under section 14 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him to stop up highways; ie two lengths of footpath both at Egremont aforesaid.

In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection, it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

*Variation of a reference to the Monopolies and Mergers Commission**Indirect electrostatic photocopiers and digital copiers*

Now therefore the Director General of Fair Trading in exercise of his powers under section 52(1) of the said Act hereby varies the said reference by adding at the end of the first paragraph (that is, immediately following the word "photocopiers") the words "and indirect electrostatic digital copiers".
