

which the remuneration or pension arrangements are individually determined shall be a special appointment.

Functions of the Commissioners, the Treasury and the Minister:

4. Without prejudice to any other function of the Commissioners under this Order, the Commissioners:

- (a) may make rules relating to the selection of persons for appointment to any situation in the Service on a Scheduled grade or to any special appointment;
- (b) shall advise the Minister concerning such rules made or to be made by him pursuant to Article 6(b) as relate to selection on merit on the basis of fair and open competition; and
- (c) shall monitor the application of such rules and, if it appears to the Commissioners to be necessary or appropriate, make recommendations or observations to the Minister.

5. The Treasury may from time to time make regulations and give instructions

- (a) providing for the number and grading of posts on the Service, the classification of all persons employed therein, their remuneration, expenses, allowances, holidays, hours of work, part-time and other working arrangements, retirement and redundancy, the reinstatement and re-employment of persons in the Service, the re-deployment of staff (below Grade 3) between departments and, so far as they relate to any of those matters, the conditions of service of all persons employed in the Service;

- (b) relating to the recruitment of persons to situations in the Service including provisions prescribing the qualifications for appointment to such situations so far as they relate to age, knowledge, ability, professional attainment, aptitude or potential.

6. The Minister may from time to time make regulations and give instructions

- (a) for controlling the conduct of the Service, and providing for, so far as they relate to matters other than those specified in Article 5(a), the conditions of service of all persons employed therein;
- (b) relating to the selection for appointment to any situation in the Service (except a situation in a Scheduled grade or which is a special appointment); and
- (c) prescribing the qualifications for appointment to situations in the Service so far as they relate to matters other than age, knowledge, ability, professional attainment, aptitude or potential.

Exercise of the Commissioners' powers and duties

7.—(1) Any power or duty of the Commissioners under this Order may be exercised by

- (a) the First Civil Service Commissioner, or any Commissioner authorised for that purpose by him; or
- (b) any officer of the Commissioners authorised for that purpose by the Commissioners.

(2) The Commissioners may from time to time and to such extent as they think fit authorise any person to perform any of their functions relating to the selection and recruitment of persons prior to the exercise by them of their power of approval under Article 3(1).

Citation etc.

8.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Civil Service Order in Council 1991, and shall come into force on the first day of April 1991.

(2) The principal Order is hereby revoked.

(3) Without prejudice to paragraph (4) below, nothing in the said revocation shall affect any instrument or other thing whatsoever made or done or having effect as if made or done under the principal Order, and every such instrument or thing shall continue in force and so far as it could have been made or done under this Order shall have effect as if made or done under this Order.

(4) The Interpretation Act 1978 (1978 c. 30) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order and of any regulations or orders made under this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if for the purposes of section 16(1) of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the principal Order were an Act of Parliament thereby repealed.
