HIS Day, at half an Hour past Seven in the Morning, died our late most Gracious Sovereign Queen Anne, in the Fiftieth Year of Her Age, and the Thirteenth of Her Reign; a Princess of exemplary Piety and Virtue. Her Majesty complain'd on Thursday last of a Pain in Her Head: . The next Day She was seized with Convulsion Fits, and for some time lost the use of Her Speech and Senses, which, tho' She afterwards recovered upon the Application of proper Remedies, She continued in a very weak and languishing Condition till She expired. Upon Her Death the Lords of the Privy-Council immediately affembled at St. James's, and gave Orders for Proclaiming the Most High and Mighty Prince George, Elector of Brunswick-Lunenburg, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, &c. His Majesty was accordingly Proclaimed with the usual Solemnity before the Gate of His Palace at St. James's, at Charing Cross, at Temple-Bar, at the End of Woodstreet in Cheapfide, and lastly at the Royal Exchange. Great Numbers of the Nobility and Principal Gentry affished at each Proclamation, and attended in their Coaches during the whole Solemnity.

W Here it hath pleased Almighty God to call to His Mercy our late Sovereign Lady Queen Anne, of Blessed Memory, by whose Decease the Imperial Crowns of Great Britain, France, and Ire-Imperial Crowns of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, are Solely and Rightfully come to the High and Mighty Prince George Elector of Brunswick-Lunenburg: We therefore the Lords Spiritual and Temporal of the Realm, being here Assistant with those of Her late Majesties Privy-Council, with Numbers of other Principal Gentlemen of Quality, with the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of London, do now hereby, with one full Voice and Consent of Tongue and Heart, Publish and Proclaim, That the High and Mighty Prince George Consent of Tongue and Heart, Publish and Proclaim, That the High and Mighty Prince George Elector of Brunswick-Lunenburg, is now, by the Death of our late Sovereign, of Happy Memory, become our only Lawful and Rightful Liege Lord, George, by the Grace of God, King of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, &c. To whom we do Acknowledge all Faith and constant Obedience, with all hearty and humble Affection: Beseching God, by whom Kings and Queens do Reign, to Bless the Royal King George with Long and Happy Tears to Reign over us.
