TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (Old Bridge, Haverfordwest, Dyfed) (Variation) Order 1991

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has on the application of Preseli Pembrokeshire District Council, made an Order under sections 249 and 333 of the above Act.

The proposed Order varies The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (Old Bridge, Haverfordwest, Dyfed) Order 1989. The effect of the variation is to permit the use of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice by vehicles being used on behalf of the owners or occupiers for the time being of No. 2 Old Bridge, Haverfordwest, for the purpose of:

- (i) the delivery of goods to and from that property for as long as may be necessary to load or unload such goods only; and
- (ii) the carrying out of all works associated with the development of that property pursuant to planning consents issued and/or to be issued, provided that at least 14 days prior written notice shall be given to the Preseli Pembrokeshire District Council of the proposed commencement of such work.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990; or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act

he may within 6 weeks of 1st April 1991 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The highway to which the Order relates is at Haverfordwest in the County of Dyfed and is that length of highway known as Old Bridge which extends from its junction with the riverside Market access in a general north-easterly direction for a distance of 160 yards. (3 SI)

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Stopping-up of Highways (Coed-Y-Cwm, Ynysybwl, Mid-Glamorgan) Order 1991

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the stopping-up of the highways described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development of a residential estate, for which planning permission has been granted, to be carried out.

The proposed Order requires the provision of new roads which will be highways maintainable at public expense and for which Mid-Glamorgan County Council shall be the Highway Authority.

In the preparation of an objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The highways to be stopped-up are at Ynysybwl in the county of Mid-Glamorgan and comprise those lengths of un-named highway at Coed-y-Cwm which extend:

1. From a point 120 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge in a general south-westerly direction to a point 185 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge, a distance of 65 metres.
2. From a point 185 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge in a general north-westerly direction to a point 365 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge, a distance of 180 metres.
3. From a point 377 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge in a general north-westerly direction to a point 414 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge, a distance of 37 metres.
4. From a point 425 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge in a general north-westerly direction to a point 443 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge, a distance of 18 metres.
5. From a point 460 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge in a general north-westerly direction to a point 476 metres north-west of the Railway Bridge, a distance of 16 metres. (4 SI)
