ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14

*The A17 Trunk Road (Cross Keys Bridge, Sutton Bridge)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 1991*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order on the A17 Trunk Road known as Cross Keys Bridge at Sutton Bridge in the district of South Holland in the county of Lincolnshire.

The Order has been made to enable remedial works to the surfacing on the approaches to the length of trunk road known as Cross Keys Bridge to be carried out and will be in force from 7 p.m. on Wednesday, 15th May 1991, to 6 a.m. on Thursday, 16th May 1991.

Alternative Routes:

Eastbound traffic will be directed via the A1101 to Wisbech and then the A47 to rejoin the A17 at Kings Lynn.

Westbound traffic will be directed along the same route in the opposite direction.

ACQUISITION OF LAND ACT 1981

The A13 Trunk Road (A117 Junction Improvement) Compulsory Purchase Order (No.) 19

Open Space Land South of Newham Way, Beckton

The Secretary of State for Transport has prepared this draft Compulsory Purchase Order which he proposes to make. If made it will authorise the purchase of land forming part of an open space as defined in the Acquisition of Land Act 1981, that is, land laid out as a public garden or used for the purposes of public recreation or a disused burial ground. This land is described in Schedule 1 to this notice and is shown coloured pink on map (a) referred to in paragraph 4 below.

2. The Order will be subject to special parliamentary procedure unless the Secretary of State for the Environment gives a certificate under section 19(1) of the Act. He has been asked by the Secretary of State for Transport to certify under section 19(1)(a) that he is satisfied that other land has been or will be given in exchange for the open space, which is not less in area and is equally advantageous to any persons entitled to rights of common or other rights and to the public, and that the land given in exchange has been or will be vested in the persons in whom the open space was vested, subject to the same rights, trusts and incidents as attach to the open space. The land proposed to be given in exchange is described in Schedule 2 hereto and is shown coloured green and described as plot number 1 on map (b) referred to in paragraph 4 below.

3. The Secretary of State for the Environment is required to give formal notice of his intention to issue a certificate before he reaches a decision, to give an opportunity for objections to be made. He hereby gives such notice. Any representations or objections in relation to this proposal should be made in writing and addressed to the Department of the Environment, Room 2524, Millbank Tower, 21-24 Millbank, London SW1P 4QU, before 3rd June 1991, quoting ref. LRP31/G5750/01.

4. Maps showing (a) the open space proposed to be purchased and (b) the land proposed to be given in exchange may be seen, without payment, at all reasonable hours at the Department of Transport, London Regional Office, Room C4/19, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB; the London Dockland Development

5. The Secretary of State for the Environment may, if he considers it expedient, hold a public inquiry into the matter.
