1. The City of Southampton (Mayflower Road/Leighton Avenue)
Traffic Regulation Order 1991.

Effect of the Order:

To make permanent the City of Southampton (Mayflower Road/Leighton Avenue) (Experimental) Traffic Regulation Order 1990. The effect of this will be to:

- (a) Prohibit motor vehicles from using the access road between Mayflower Road and Leighton Avenue with an exception for Local Authority Vehicles, Statutory Undertaken Vehicles, Emergency Vehicles and Pedal Cycles.
- (b) To introduce lengths of "No Waiting at Any Time" as follows: (i) On Both sides of Mayflower Road from the south-western closed end of Mayflower Road north-eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.
  - (ii) At the south-western closed end of Mayflower Road for its entire length.
- (iii) On the north-east side of Leighton Avenue from the south-eastern closed end of Leighton Avenue north-westward for a distance of 15 metres.
- (iv) On the south west side of Leighton Avenue from the south-eastern closed end of Leighton Avenue north-westward for a distance of 18.5 metres.
- (v) At the south-eastern closed end of Leighton Avenue for its entire length.
- 2. The City of Southampton (Western Approaches and adjoining Roads) (Part One) (Amendment No. 5) Order 1991

Effect of the Order:

To introduce "No Waiting at Any Time" throughout the service road on the south-west of Gover Road adjacent to the Leyland-DAF Service Centre.

3. The City of Southampton (Allington Road Lebanon Road|Oakridge Road) (Restriction of Waiting) (Amendment No. 1) Order 1991

Effect of the Order:

To revoke the "No Waiting, Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m." on northern side of Oakridge Road, Redbridge, from a point 17.5 metres west of Allington Road, westwards for a distance of 63.5 metres to the end of the existing restriction.

4. The City of Southampton (Portswood District Centre) (Traffic Regulation) (Amendment No. 7) Order 1991

revoke the "No waiting at Any Time" on the eastern side of righ Noad, Swaythling, from a point 44.5 metres south of the extended southern kerb-line of Rayners Gardens, southwards for a distance of 39 metres.

 The City of Southampton (Bitterne/Midanbury/Harefield/Townhill Park) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Amendment No. 11) Order 1991

Effect of the Order:

- (a) To extend the existing "No Waiting at Any Time" on the east side of Tatwin Crescent from the existing double yellow lines at the northern end of the road to a point 15 metres south of the junction with Tatwin Close;
- (b) To introduce a 50 metre length of "No Waiting at Any Time" on both sides of Tatwin Close, extending eastwards from its junction with Tatwin Crescent;
- (c) To introduce "No Waiting at Any Time" on the west side of Tatwin Crescent from a point 15 metres north of its junction with Tatwin Close to a point south of that junction; and
- with Tatwin Close to a point south of that junction; and (d) To extend the existing section of "No Waiting at Any Time" on the south east side of Kathleen Road by 5 metres outside number 250.

Implementation Date: These Orders will come into operation on 20th May 1991.
