



Church, to return Thanks for the Birth of the King of Portugal's second Son. A severe Order had been made against clandestine Marriages, of which there had lately been a great Number. We have received advice from Naples, that Signor Argento, President of the Council, had received Directions from Vienna, to send the Imperial Ministers a particular account of all the Points in Dispute with the Court of Rome, upon the Subject of the Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, that they might enter upon a Treaty for accommodating those Differences, as soon as they were fully inform'd of the Matter. The Office of Montero Major, which had great Privileges annex'd to it, and had occasioned several Contests with the People of that Kingdom, had been bought at the Publick Expence, for the Sum of Ninety thousand Ducats, Fifty thousand of which were paid into the Treasury, and Forty thousand to the Duke de Limarola, who was in Possession of that Employment. Several Vessels were arriv'd from Messina at Reggio, notwithstanding that all Commerce with the Kingdom of Sicily had been forbidden by the Government of Naples.

Vienna, August 25. N. S. Count Coningteck, Plenipotentiary of his Imperial Majesty, set out two Days ago for the Low Countries, in order to Treat with the Deputies of the States General upon the Subject of their Barrier. The Emperor continues his Resolution of going soon to Presbourg, where the Empress is to be Crown'd Queen of Hungary. It is said Prince Eugene's departure to the Congress of Baden, is fixed on for the 27th Instant. They write from Reisin, that the Deputies of several Palatinates of Poland were arriv'd at that Place, and had been admitted to an Audience of King Augustus, in which they had made great Complaints of the Exactions of the Saxon Troops, and insisted that a General Diet should be convened, in order to redress the publick Grievances. Letters from Constantinople bring an account, that it was still very uncertain when the King of Sweden would set out from Demotica, in order to return into his own Dominions, his Majesty having desired a larger Sum of the Ottoman Port to enable him to depart from thence, and the Turkish Ministers on the contrary demanding the Money the Grand Signior had already lent him.
