The M65 Motorway (Bamber Bridge to Whitebirk Section, Blackburn Southern By-pass) and Connecting Roads Scheme 1991 Variation Scheme 1991

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following scheme variations:

A scheme variation under sections 16, 17, 19 and 326 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him:

(a) to disregard a route from the westbound carriageway of the M65 Motorway to the Whitebirk roundabout (junction 6 on the M65) giving access to Blackburn Road (A678) and Whitebirk Drive (A6119); being given ref. No. 35 on the scheme plan 3 of the M65 Motorway (Bamber Bridge to Whitebirk Section, Blackburn Southern By-pass) and Connecting Roads Scheme 1991; and

(b) to insert a route from the westbound carriageway of the M65 Motorway to the Whitebirk roundabout (junction 6 on the M65) giving access to Blackburn Road (A678) and Whitebirk Drive (A6119); being given ref. No. 35 on the scheme plan 2A in the deposited plan.

The M65 Motorway (Bamber Bridge to Whitebirk Section, Blackburn Southern By-pass) and Connecting Roads (Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 1991

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Order:

An Order under sections 12, 18 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, which will authorise him:

- (i) to carry out the improvement of highways,
- (ii) to stop up highways,

- (iii) to construct new highways,
- (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
- (v) to provide new means of access to premises,

all on or in the vicinity of the routes of the M65 Motorway (Bamber Bridge to Whitebirk section, Blackburn Southern By-pass) and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Lancashire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.
