TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Stopping-up of Highways (Pentrebach Industrial Estate, Merthyr Tydfil, Mid Glamorgan) Order 1991

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, to authorise the stopping-up of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to enable the development consisting of a car parking facility, for which planning permission has been granted, to be carried out.

Copies of the Order may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of Merthyr Tydfil Borough Council, Civic Centre, Merthyr Tydfil, Mid Glamorgan.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990; or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act

he may within 6 weeks of 27th August 1991 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The highway to be stopped up is at Pentrebach in the county of Mid Glamorgan and is the length of highway verge which extends from a point on the western corner of the factory property known as "Design & Manufacture Ltd." being 16 metres south-east of the centreline of the A4060 for a distance of 55 metres south-east of that point. The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of a bus stop and turning space between Oak Cash and Carry and Maxpax House, Beaumont Road, Banbury, to enable development consisting of the construction of a unit or units for office/industrial use to be carried out in accordance

with deemed planning permission granted by Cherwell District Council under Part III of the said Act.
