The fresh meat described above is obtained from animals which have remained in the territory of the United States of America or a neighbouring country on the list referred to in

Council Decision 79/542/EEC for meat of domestic solipeds, for at least three months before being slaughtered or since birth in the case of animals less than three months old.

B. Any meat of offal imported under this licence shall be made available if so required for inspection by an Officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspection. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection in such manner as he shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection.
