## **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

### The A46 and A17 Trunk Roads (Newark Relief Road) (De-Restriction) Order 1991

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 82(2) and 83(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which comes into force on 26th October 1991 and is to remove the 30 miles per hour limit from those lengths of the A46 and A17 Trunk Roads described in the Schedule to this Notice.

## **HIGHWAYS ACT 1980** ACQUISITION OF LAND ACT 1981

Notice is hereby given that Public Local Inquiries in connection with the Orders mentioned below will be held by a person to be appointed for the purpose by the Secretaries of State for the Environment and Transport on the nomination of the Lord Chancellor beginning at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, 10th December 1991 at the Leadenham Village Hall, Leadenham, Lincolnshire, to hear representations from statutory objectors (within the meaning of The Highways (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 1976, in respect of the draft Orders at (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5) below, and The Compulsory Purchase by Ministers (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 1967, in respect of the draft Order at (6) below) and also, at his discretion, to hear representations from any other persons who may desire to appear and be heard.

The Orders which have been prepared in draft by the Secretary of State for Transport under the above-mentioned Acts are:

- (1) The A17 Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass) No. 2 Order 19 notice of which was published on 6th September 1991. This is an Order under sections 10 and 41 of the Highways Act 1980 which, if made, will provide that a road about 3.91 kilometres in length which he proposes to construct at Leadenham in the Parishes of Leadenham and Fulbeck in the Districts of North and South Kesteven in the County of Lincolnshire, starting at a point on the A17 trunk road (Newark Road) about 1630 metres north-west of its junction with Cliff Road (A607) and proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction to a point on the A17 trunk road (Sleaford Road) about 150 metres southeast of its junction with North Heath Lane, shall become a trunk road.
- (2) The A17 Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass) (Detrunking) No. 2 Order 19, notice of which was published on 6th September 1991. This is an Order under sections 10 and 12 of the Highways Act 1980 which, if made, will provide that when the new road described at (1) above is open for through traffic, the existing A17 Trunk Road (between the points specified at (1) above shall cease to be a trunk road and shall be a classified road (the responsibility of Lincolnshire County Council).
- (3) The A17 Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass) (Side Roads) No. 2 Order 19 , notice of which was published on 6th September 1991. This is an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 which, if made, will authorise him-
  - (i) to carry out the improvement of highways,

  - (ii) to stop up highways,
  - (iii) to construct new highways,
  - (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
  - (v) to provide new means of access to premises, all in the vicinity of the route of the new road described at (1) above.
- (4) The Kings Lynn-Newark Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass and Slip Roads) Revocation No. 2 Order 19, notice of which was published on 6th September 1991 and which, if made, will revoke the Kings Lynn-Newark Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass and Slip Roads) Order 1973.
- (5) The Kings Lynn-Newark Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass Side Roads) Revocation No. 2 Order 19, notice of which was published on 6th September 1991 and which, if made, will revoke the Kings Lynn-Newark Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass Side Roads) Order 1976.
- (6) The A17 Trunk Road (Leadenham Bypass) Compulsory Purchase Order No. 2 (EM No. ) 19, notice of which was published on 27th September 1991 and 4th October 1991. This is an Order under sections 239, 240 and 246 of the Highways Act 1980, as extended and supplemented by section 250 of that Act, and under section 2 of the Acquisition of Land Act 1981 which, if made, will authorise him to purchase compulsorily the land and rights described therein for the purpose of construction of the new road described at (1) above, improvement of the existing A17 Trunk Road in the Districts of North and South Kesteven, construction and improvement of highways and provision of new means of access to premises in the said Districts in pursuance of the Order at (3) above, diversion of watercourses, execution of works on watercourses, use in connection with the aforementioned works and mitigating adverse effects which the existence or use of certain of the highways proposed to be constructed or improved as aforementioned will have on their surroundings.
