

Woodland species are still present both contained within the growing out of the grikes. These include hawthorn, blackthorn, ash, holly, wych elm and elder. A single specimen of yew (an uncommon tree of the limestone) occurs on the eastern half of the main pavement block. Herb species present include the uncommon 'lords and ladies' and hairy rock-cress.

Scroggs Close lies on the Urswick Limestone of Lower Carboniferous age. The bedding and jointing of this limestone favours pavement formation however the joints are closely spaced and the resulting clints are quite small. The grikes are often shallow or infilled. The site has been damaged in the past. Earthy depressions, broken rock and stockpiles of freshly removed clints are evidence of more recent damage. English Nature noted clints being removed from the site in August 1991. The total area covered by the Order is 5.5 ha.

Notice of Application for a Submarine Pipe-Line Works Authorisation

Mobil North Sea Limited hereby gives notice on behalf of itself, in accordance with the provisions of Part 1 of Schedule 4 to the Petroleum and Submarine Pipe-lines Act 1975 that it has made an application to the Secretary of State for Energy for the grant of an authorisation for the construction and use of a Gas Export Pipeline and MEG pipeline between the proposed Camelot CB Platform and the existing subsea tee assembly in the Camelot CA to Leman Pipelines.
