The Governor having come back hither before them, flood ready at the Gate to prefent the Keys to the King. At their Majeflies envrance the Cannon on the Ramparts were discharged; and as they passed thro' the Square of St. Charles, the Burghers who were drawn up in two Lines, fired their Musquets, as did the two Battalions of Hachbret and the Regiment of Schulembourg. which were possed in the Square before the Cathedral; where their M jesty's alighting, were received at the Door of the Church hysche Clergy, Nobility, and others of Diffinction: Their Majeflies going up to the High-ltar, the Choir Sung the *Te Deum* to Mufick, the Ar-thery firing a fecond time: Their Majeflies having re-

ceived the Benediction of the Vicar-General, (who Officiated in chief, the Archbishop being dead) and having performed their Devotions in a Chappel of the Cathe-dra!, proceeded to the Court: The Cannon gave a third Salvo at their entring the Palace, where they were re-ceived and complimented by all the Ladies in the great dall of the Swiis Guards, and by the Magistrates and sense in the State Room; and then their Majefties being fatigued retired from Company. It having rained continually for feveral Days past till this Moraing, the Nobility have been hindred from making a Cavalcade as they defigned in Honour of their Majeflies; the Rain has likewise prevented the firsthing a Triumphal Arch, and the playing of a Firework. This Court have revived the Ceremonial that was observed here before the laft War, according to which the Knights of the Order, the Ministers of State, and the Captains of the Guards, with the Gentlemen of the Bed-Chamber, when in waiting, are the only Perfons allowed to enter the Chambers of the King and Queen, all others being obliged to keep in the Anti-chambers and State Rooms. The Count de Wartlin is left Governor of Mellina, and the Marquis d'Andourne Governor of Palermo. The Commadore of the British Shipe of War which were of the Convoy that came with their Majellies from Sicily to Villa-franca, being come hither with tre other Offi-cers of thole Ships, the King has made him a Prefent of his Picture fet with Diamonds, and prefented the other Officers in proportion; the Queen has likewife been ve-

ry liberal in her Acknowledgments to them, Turin, Ottober 6. N. S.
