Extension to Tregony Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 that the Carrick District Council have determined that the area generally described in the Schedule to this notice, and more particularly described in the map hereinafter referred to in this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance, and have accordingly designated the said area as a Conservation Area.

The effect of the designation of the Conservation Area is that where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the conservation is made to the Council either the development would in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Area, or the development is of a kind specified by the Secretary of State, the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 73 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.

SCHEDULE

The Conservation Area has been extended on the north-east to include the continuation of Fore Street from Penlee and field OS 6991 up to Cuby House on the south-east side of Fore Street and from the Sunday School and Tregony Village Hall to St. Cuby's Church and Churchyard on the north-west side of Fore Street.

The Conservation Area has also been extended south-westwards along Tregony Hill and Well Street; down to and including Tregony Bridge, the group of buildings on the north-west side of the Bridge including Gregor House and San Tomarda and the group of buildings to the south of the Bridge including Daddiport and Springfield. There is a further small northward extension along Mill Lane. (726)

St. Probus and St. Grace's Church and Churchtown including properties surrounding the Church, extending on the south-east to include King George's Field and on the west to include St. Grace Cottage and The Sanctuary. To the north of Churchtown, the Conservation Area extends along the A390 up to and including Greenbank on the east; it includes the Square and Chapel Street up to Probus County Primary School.
