, Paris. November 14. N. S. The Reform of the French Troops is still deferred : The Plan of it is faid to be larger than any made by France fince the Peace of the Pyrenees: It is reported, that the Irith. Swifs and Ger-man Troops will be motily kept on Foot. The King has declared his Intentions to give Half-pay to the Of-ficers who shall be disbanded, and has recommended it to the Care of his Ministers to find means of doing it. Of the fitty French Battalions which were employ'd in Catalonia, thirty are to continue there in the Pay of the King of Spain, the other twenty are on their March towards France. The young Duke of St. Aignan is to go to Bayonne, to Compliment the Queen of Spain in the King's Name : His Majefty fends her for Prefents Boxes for her Toilet, a Watch fet with Diamonds, and other Yuch like Curiofities. As the Difficulty in relation to the fending an Ambaffador to Vienna (which was the Precedence that was formerly given to the Ambaffador from Spain, as coming from the most August House) is now at an end; it is faid, that the Duke de la Force is likely to be the Perlon named for Ambaflador to the Imperial Court, and it is expected that Count Koning-feck may come with the fame Character hither. The Elector of Cologn was at Marli on the 11th Inftant, and had an Audience of the King at 3 in the Afternoon; it was but fhort, and his Electoral Highnefs immediately fet out on his return to Paris. The Firework which was to have been on the 11th in the Place de Ireve, on Occafion of the Peace between the Emperor and Empire and France, is put off till the 15th at Night, when there will be a Publick Supper in the Hô el de Ville, which the Duke de Tremes, as Governor of this City, gives upon this Solemnity. 'Tis adviled from Madrid, that the Marshal Berwick arrived there the 28th past. We have, News here, that the great Dutchefs of Tufcany is at the laft Extremity,

Bruffels, Nov. 14. N. S. Lieutenant-General Cadogan arrived here on the 11th in the Evening from Antwerp and Yesterday Count Koningseck, the Emperor's Minister for regulating the Barrier, came hither likewife, with Messieurs Geldermalsen and Gockinga, two of the -States Deputies: Their Collegues Count Rechteren and M. vander Duffen are gone to the Hague, to make Re-port to their Principals of what paffed in the Conference held at Antwerp after the return of the Courier, which Count Koningfeck had fent to Vienna. That Minifter propofes to return to Antwerp in a Day or two, with Mr. Cadogan and the Dutch Deputies. Mr. Cadogan fince his arrival here, has been every Day in Conference

with M. Vandenberg and the Reg ney, upon the ordinary Affairs of these Provinces. Two French Cabinet Couriers have lately paffed by this Place with Difpatches for M. de Chateauneuf Ambaffador from France at the Hague. Our Letters from the Frontiers confirm the Accounts we had formerly, that the great Reduction which had been refolved to be made among the French Troops, is put off till further Order.
