NATIONAL RIVERS AUTHORITY—THAMES REGION

Notice of application for licence to abstract water

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority—Thames Region by the Maidenbower Consortium, Maidenbower Village, Balcome Road, Worth, Crawley, West Sussex, for a licence to abstract the following quantities of water from the diverted Forest Stream adjacent to the proposed Road 1 at Maidenbower Village.

Abstraction of 40 gallons per minute (maximum) at a point opposite the proposed Community Centre. The abstracted water will be diverted through a proposed water feature and returned to the Stamford Brook approximately 20 metres to the north of its confluence with the diverted Forest Stream.

A copy of the application and of any map, plan or other document submitted with it, may be inspected, free of charge, at the Maidenbower Village Project Office, at the above address, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on Wednesday, 8th January 1992, and ending one month after that date.

BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

Birmingham City Council (Rocky Lane, Nechells) (Weight Restriction) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be as follows:

To introduce a maximum gross weight restriction of 17 tonnes (no exemptions) in that length of Rocky Lane, as is carried by the bridge over the Birmingham and Fazeley Canal.

DYFED COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Dyfed (Class II Road, Hermon, Cynwyl Elfed) (Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that on 6th January 1992, the Dyfed County Council made an Order under section 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, ("the Act"), the effect of which is to impose a 40 m.p.h. speed limit in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice. The Order will come into operation on 17th January 1992, and a copy of the Order, together with a map indicating the length of road affected, may be inspected at the offices of the Dyfed County Council, County Hall, Carmarthen, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of this Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied

with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

EASTBOURNE BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Eastborne (Enys Road/The Goffs/Upperton Road) (Experimental Traffic Regulation) Order 1992

Notice is hereby given that Eastbourne Borough Council (acting as agents for East Sussex County Council) has made an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which, for an experimental period of 6 months.

(a) prohibits vehicles (except for police, fire service, ambulance or emergency services vehicles) from entering or leaving Enys Road at its junction with Upperton Road;

(b) relocates the ambulance bay in Upperton Road to a point 23 metres further north-west; and

(c) prohibits waiting along 50 metres of the north side of The Goffs from its junction with Upperton Road, and along both sides of Upperton Road outside Millfield Court.

The alternative routes for vehicles requiring access to (or through) Enys Road from Upperton Road will be via either Hartfield Road and Upperton Lane, or The Avenue and Carew Road. These measures are required to improve safety in conjunction with junction improvement works to be carried out by East Sussex County Council, and will come into operation on 20th January 1992, (which is not less than seven days from the date of this notice). At the end of the 6 month experimental period, Eastbourne Borough Council will decide whether to extend the experiment; make the above measures permanent; or abandon them, and the Council's intentions will be publicised again at that time.

Establishment of Pedestrian Crossing in Hope Farm Road, Great Sutton
