- (8) The rights to display certain types of illuminated advertisement without express consent under the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 1989 (No. 670) Schedule 3, Class 4A and 4B is excluded and
- (9) Grants and loans become payable under sections 77 to 80 of the Act.
