Notice of invitation for proposals to build and finance a tolled Western Orbital Route west of Birmingham

The Department of Transport of the United Kingdom hereby invites pre-qualification proposals from firms and consortia as prospective promoters to build and finance a tolled road round the western side of the West Midlands conurbation.

The contract would be to design, build, finance and operate the road, under a concession agreement with the Department. Costs would be recovered through tolls charged by the concessionaire.

The route should broadly follow the Department's published preferred route for the Western Orbital Route. This provides for a motorway standard road linking the M5 and M42 motorways near Bromsgrove to the M6 and the proposed privately financed Birmingham Northern Relief Road north of the M54.

Completion of the new road is expected by the late 1990s.

- (a) that a demand exists or is likely to arise for the conveyance of gas of, or of a kind similar to, the kind specified in the notice relating to a proposed pipeline; and
- (b) that the routes along which the gas will require to be conveyed will severally be, as to the whole or any part thereof, the same or substantially the same as the route or any part of the route so
