Stockholm. Nov. 20. O. S. The 18th an Express came hither from Carlscrona, with Letters of the 14th Instant from Lieutenant General Lieven, which brought an Account that on the 11th, the Day before that General left Stralfund, the King of Sweden arrived at that Place. The faid General has only by this Express sent the Senate a short Letter from his Majesty, ordering only some Pages, Footmen, and Cooks. to be forthwith dispatched over to him; but he writes that he has also Letters with him from the King to the Queen Grandmother and to the Princess, but as he designed to set out from Carlscrona the next Morning after the Express came away, he was desirous of having the Honour to deliver them with his own Hands. Copenhagen, Decemb. 8. N. S. Orders are given for some Regiments to reinforce those which are already. in the Posts near the Rivers Trave, Steekenitz, and Bille, to guard the Passage into Helstein; and all the Troops which are in that Dutchy, have Orders to advance to the same Posts in Case of Necessity, Orders are also given for the Regiments which are in Jutland to march to Holstein. Five Men of War are fitting out, to joyn two which are at Sea and form a small Squadron to cruile in these Parts. General Dewitz set out from hence two Days ago: He is to be the King's first Plenipotentiary at the Congress at Brunswick; but before he goes thither, he is to proceed to Berlin about some Ne-gociation with that Court. 'Tis supposed, that if the King of Sweden marches to attack the Danish Army in Holstein, General Dewitz will return immediately to bis 'Tis faid the King will go into Hol-Post in the Army. stein as foon as the Troops are all drawn together there, but this is not as yet certain: Since the Duke Adminishator of Holstein declares himself openly an Enemy to this Court, it has been resolved to take Possession of his Bisheprick of Eutin,

Hambourg, Dec. 18. N. S. The Preparations of War are continued at Berlin. A good Number of Cannon, vith Bombs and Bullets, are already drawn out of the Arienal there: 20 Battallions and 10 Squadrons are actually on the March, and like Orders are fent to other Regiments: Count Dohna, General of Foot, and the Lieutenant-Generals Natimar and Finck, are nominated to command this Body of Forces: The Prince of Anhalt-Dessau is to be Generalissimo; but if the King puts himself at the Head of them, as is believed, that Prince will accompany His Majesty, as a Volunteer: All the Prussian Officers have received express Orders to repair to their respective Regiments, on pain of being cashiered: 'Tis thought these Forces will have their general Rendezvous appointed in the Neighbourhood of Stetin. The King of Sweden continues at Stralfund, where the Hereditary-Prince of Heise Cassel was expected some Days ago: M. de Croiffy, Brother of the Marquis de Torcy, is also expected there, in the Quality of Envoy from the King of France. Count Flemming being appointed by the King of Poland to be his Plenipotentiary at the Congress at Brunswick, is arrived from Warsaw at Dresden in his Way thither. Yesterday General Dewitz set out from hence for the Court of Berlin. The Danes have taken Possession of the Bishoprick of Eutin, and the Danish Relident here has communicated to all the other Ministers the Reasons which have induced the King his Mafter to that Proceeding. Baron Eofander, Quarter-Mafter-General in the Service of the King of Sweden, is arrived at Berlin, and has made some Propositions on

the Parkof his Swedish Majesty to the King of Prussia.
