Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority, Yorkshire Region by Thomas Wilkinson, of 4 Hall Avenue, Sutton-in-Craven, near Keighley, West Yorkshire BD20 7NL, for a licence to abstract the following quantities of water from Lumb Clough Beck, at SE0063 4387 in the parish of Sutton, Craven District, North Yorkshire, 16,060,000 gallons per annum, 44,000 gallons per day, and 1,834 gallons per hour. The water is required to maintain flow through an existing disused millpond throughout the year. The pond has become a conservation area.

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

### ST. HELENS METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

CLEAR AIR ACT 1956, SECTION 11  
(AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT PLANNING AND LAND  
ACT 1980)

#### *St. Helens (No. 28) Smoke Control Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that the St. Helens Metropolitan Borough Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act, propose to make an Order entitled the "St. Helens (No. 28) Smoke Control Order 1992", declaring the area described in the First Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area.

The general effect of the proposed Order will be to make the occupier of any building within the said area from the chimney of which smoke is emitted on any day, guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £400, unless the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The Order will not come into operation before 1st November 1992.

A copy of the Order and the map referred to in the Order may be inspected at the offices of the Director of Environmental and Design Services, Wesley House, Corporation Street, St. Helens, during a period of 6 weeks from 16th April 1992.

Within the said period of 6 weeks any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Chief Executive, Town Hall, St. Helens, object to the making of the Order.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE

An area of 299 acres (121 hectares) or thereabouts bounded by a line commencing at a point at the junction of Alexander Drive and Borough Road. Thence in a general southerly direction along the centre-line of Alexander Drive to its junction with Stafford Road. Thence in a general easterly direction following the boundary line of the St. Helens (No. 8) Smoke Control Order 1973 to its junction with the St. Helens (No. 9) Smoke Control Order (1974). Thence in a general easterly direction following this boundary line to its junction with Peasley Cross Lane. Thence in a general northerly direction along the centre-line of Peasley Cross Lane and Warrington New Road to its junction with Parr Street. Thence in a general westerly direction along the centre-lines of Parr Street, Church Street and Chalon Way to its junction with Canal Street. Thence in a general southerly direction along the centre-line of Canal Street to its junction with Bold Street. Thence in a general westerly direction following the boundary lines of the St. Helens (No. 3) 1966 and (No. 8) 1973 Smoke Control Orders back to its starting point at Alexander Drive. (496)

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

### AVON COUNTY COUNCIL

#### *County of Avon (Queens Square Area, Outer Zone, City of Bristol) (General Traffic Regulation) Experimental Order 1992*

Notice is hereby given that on 17th May 1992 the County Council of Avon made an Order under section 9 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, the effect of which is, for a maximum period of 18 months:

1. to prohibit any vehicle entering, proceeding or waiting in any of the lengths of roads specified in Part I and Part II of Schedule 1 to this notice;
2. to institute one-way traffic working in the roads specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 to this notice in the direction indicated in relation to that length of road in column 2 of the said Schedule;
3. to prohibit any vehicle proceeding in any of the roads specified in column 1 of Schedule 3 to this notice from making a right turn into the road specified in relation to that road in column 2 of the said Schedule;
4. to suspend the existing one-way traffic working in Grove Avenue, Middle Avenue, Mill Avenue and Queen Square Avenue. These roads will revert to two-way traffic working for the duration of this experimental Order; and
5. to suspend the County Council of Avon (Redcliffe Way and Queen Square Area, Bristol) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1980 for the duration of this experimental Order. Prohibited movements are imposed by the aforementioned Order which will not be required whilst this experimental Order is in operation.

Objections and representations to this experimental Order continuing indefinitely, together with the grounds on which they are made, should be sent in writing to the undermentioned address quoting ref. No. LET/EP-2-010 by 20th November 1992. The County Council of Avon will consider in due course whether the provisions contained in the experimental Order should be continued indefinitely. At that time any objections and comments received will be given consideration. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the County Council and that the substance of any representation, together with the name and address of the person making it, could become available for public inspection.

This Order will come into operation on 17th May 1992 and a copy thereof, together with a map, a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order and copies of the Orders to be suspended may
